

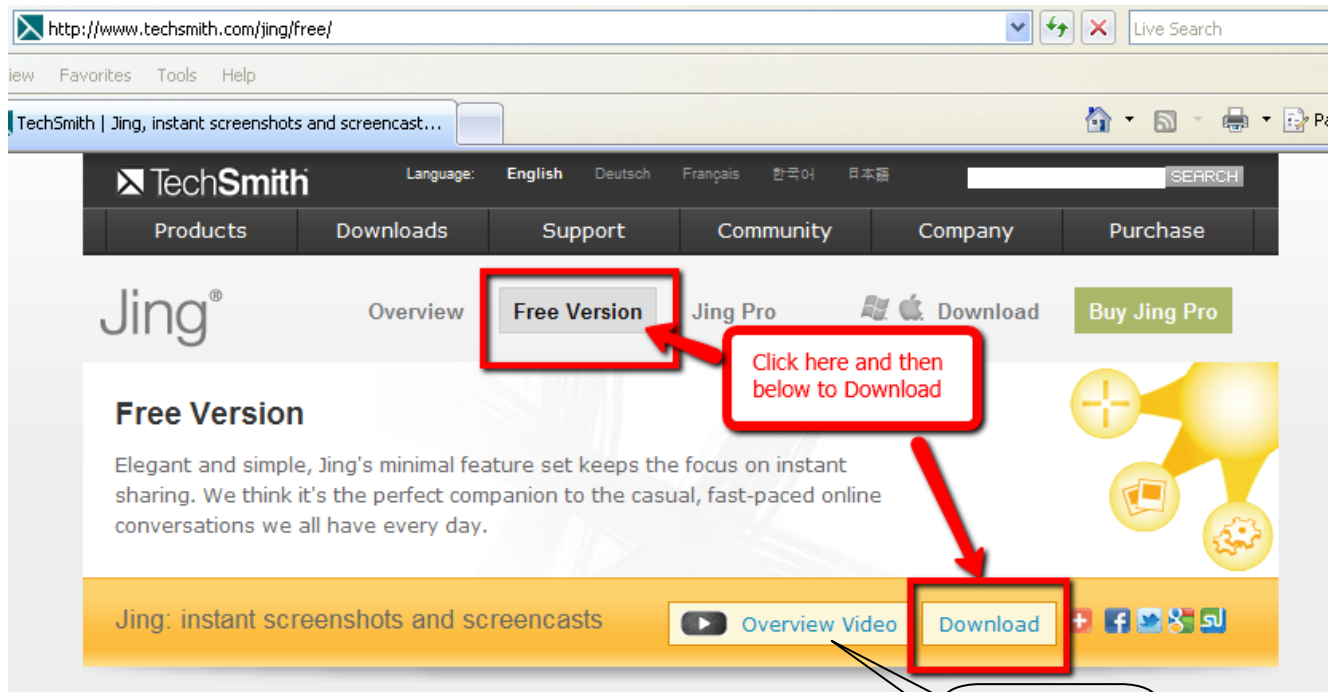

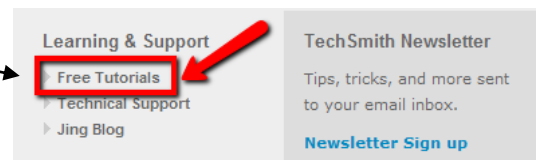
When you create a Jing® account it will give you a place to download your 'jings' in www.screencast.com
