Books / Government Documents

NOTE: This guide single spaces citations to conserve space. Remember to double space your Works Cited!

Basic Format - Books:

Author. Title of the Book. Place of Publication: Publisher, date of publication.

- **Book with one author:**

- **Book with two authors:**
Eggs, Suzanne, and Diane Slade. Analysing Casual Conversation. London: Cassell, 1997.
- **Book with an editor:**
Powell, Kevin, ed. Step into a World: A Global Anthology of the New Black Literature. New York: Wiley, 2000.
- **Signed chapter in edited book:**
Stott, Jon C. "Power, Freedom, and Imprisonment in *Tuck Everlasting*." The Phoenix Award of The Children's Literature Association 1995-1999. Eds. Alethea Helbig and Agnes Perkins. Lanham, MD: Scarecrow, 2001. 37-42.
- **Unsigned article in well-known encyclopedia or dictionary:**

Author. Title of the Book. Place of Publication: Publisher, date of publication. Name of Database. Name of Subscribing Institution, Name of Library, City, State. Date of your access.

Author. "Article Title." Title of the Book. Editor. Place of Publication: Publisher, date of publication. Page numbers. Name of Database. Name of Service. Name of Subscribing Institution, Name of Library, City, State. Date of your access.

Basic Format - Article from scholarly journal paginated by volume:

Author. "Article Title." Journal Title. Volume (Year): Page numbers.

Basic Format - Article from a popular weekly magazine:

Author. "Article Title." Magazine Title. Date: Page numbers.

- **Article in daily newspaper:**

Wilford, John Noble. "In a Golden Age of Discovery, Faraway Worlds Beckon." New York Times 9 Feb. 1997, late ed., sec. 1: 1+.

Electronic Periodicals (from library databases)

(Frequently online articles do not have page numbers. In that case, include the total number of pages, paragraphs or other sections, if they are numbered.)

Basic Format - Electronic periodicals from library databases:

➔ Use the same formats as print periodicals, **but also add:**

Name of Database. Name of Service. Name of Subscribing Institution, Name of Library, City, State.
Date of your access.

For example - Journal article from library database:

Author. "Article Title." Journal Title. Volume.Issue (Year): Page numbers. Name of Database. Name of Service. Name of Subscribing Institution, Name of Library, City, State. Date of your access.
