Books: Use the Online Catalog

To find **books** put on **Reserve** by your instructor:

1. At the Library home page, select **Class Reserves**. (Takes you to the Library book catalog.)
2. Fill out either **Class Name and Number** or **Instructor's Name**.

Electronic Reserves: Select **Electronic Reserves (E-Res)** for WS101 material available 24/7.
Course-specific password required.

To find books **about** a famous woman:

1. Select **Subject**. Type last name first. You can also try **Keyword** for more results.
2. For each book, be sure to note the **Location**, **Call #**, and **Status**.

To find books/poetry **by** a famous woman, select **Author**.



Not finding enough? The book you want is checked out? "Repeat in Summit"

- **Summit** = Over 30 academic libraries in Washington & Oregon
- **Books sent here within 3 working days**

Reference Books:

- Books are organized by **subject**. The **first letter** of a book's **call number** is a clue to its subject.
- For example, to find books about women artists, go to the **N** section of Reference, where you'll find *Dictionary of Women Artists* (Ref N8354 .D53 1997)
- **See the purple "Women's Studies" handout for more reference books**
- Also, try **Gale Virtual Reference Library** – 50+ full-text online encyclopedias. At the **library web page**, select **Reference Tools**.

Articles in Periodicals (Magazines, Journals, Newspapers):

Electronic access to articles in a wide-variety of subjects, including women's studies, is available through **EBSCOhost Academic Search Premier & ProQuest**. You can limit to **scholarly / refereed / peer reviewed** journals in both databases.

- For information about a woman **author/poet**, go back to **Articles & Newspapers**, select **Literature Resource Center**.
- Go back to **Articles & Newspapers**. Select **New York Times Historical 1851-2003**.

Web Pages:

- From the Cannell Library Home Page, select **Library Class Links → Women's Studies 101**
- Also, try www.google.com
 - Use this for information about a woman: "Maya Angelou"
 - To find poetry, type the author's name in quotes, followed by the word *poetry*:
"Maya Angelou" poetry
