What is yolink? A browser add-on that allows you to mine hyperlinks and see more context to searches on the web and in library databases. Download free at www.yolink.com. (Works in either Firefox or Explorer). A tool bar will be added to your browser.

Searches can be saved and shared with groups. Also links to EasyBib. (free for MLA 7) To save searches, you must set up an account. You do not need an account to search.

Searches during this session:

1. www.epa.gov/climatechange/emissions/index.html
 - a. Type Methane Gas in search box and MATCH ALL.
2. www.economist.com
 - a. Type SOMALIA PIRATES in the economist search box
 - b. Highlight result links. Search SHIP ATTACKS (MATCH ALL)
 - c. Search highlighted links
3. ProQuest Example: Go to ProQuest on Library website
 - a. Search OBAMA AND HEALTHCARE AND COSTS
 - b. Limit to FT and limit to newspapers
 - c. Type PUBLIC OPTION in yolink search box
 - d. Change to EXACT MATCH and search.
 - e. Do a Save it to a folder
4. Do Google search: OBAMA HEALTHCARE COSTS
 - a. Type PUBLIC OPTION in Yolink search box
 - b. Change to exact match. Search
 - c. Save and Share. Look at folder management options.

Setting up your account: Click on *Save & Share* on your Yolink toolbar.

Then Click on:



and follow the directions.
