CLARK Junior College may not be the largest institution of its kind in the state and it may be true that it has been struggling along with insufficient funds to do the things it would like to do, but there is one thing that splendid little junior college has done — it has not lost sight of the value of high scholarship requirements and a high standard for scholastic requirements.

Acceptance of Clark Junior College as an accredited junior college by the University of Washington should have a tremendous effect on the attendance at this college next year. It means that students satisfactorily finishing the sophomore year at the Vancouver institution may have all their grades earned here accepted and may then enter the state university for the final two years and go right on through to graduation, without loss of time.

Chief requirement of the college now is more housing space and more equipment. Business interests of this city would do well, we believe, to institute a drive for a considerable fund for endowment of the college. College students spending their money here are of more value to the community than college students spending their money in Seattle. The chamber of commerce in most communities will spend money for a site for a factory that will produce a payroll. Why then, isn't it sensible to spend money for buildings to aid the growth of a college which will ultimately develop into keeping and bringing hundreds of the youth of this city here.
