

SIX ARE ON JUNIOR COLLEGE FACULTY

Making plans for the opening of classes next month, the Vancouver Junior college, which is under the management of John W. Todd, has engaged a faculty of six members, it was announced today. Two are former Vancouver high school graduates, and they will teach a variety of subjects.

Raymond A. Busco, graduate here in 1923 and of the University of Washington in 1928, will instruct in business administration courses, according to the announcement. Gilbert Erlandson, O. S. C., graduate who is now completing work for his master's degree, will handle psychology and social science subjects.

Dramatics and art classes are to be under the direction of Marian Hendrick, M. A., graduate of the teachers college at Columbia university, New York, and former instructor at Linfield college. Robert T. Oliver, who took his B. A. degree at Pacific university and his M. A. at the University of Oregon, and who was graduate assistant for two years there, will teach English.

Miriam M. Reinhart, who took her master's degree at the University of Washington after graduating at Reed college, is the instructor in history and mathematics. Ralph Hanna, Vancouver high school and University of Washington graduate, will be the instructor in foreign languages.

Registration is to begin Sept. 28, and the classes will start Oct. 2.
