

# WHY CLARK JUNIOR COLLEGE WANTS YOUR SUPPORT IN RAISING \$5,000.

1. The money is to go into permanent equipment which will become the property of this district when a public, tax-supported junior college is established here.

2. A junior college is badly needed here, but can not be publicly established under state law. Hence, informal public support is needed. This is the means by which the eight other junior colleges in the state are supported.

3. Clark Junior College is a non-profit incorporation, owned by 45 public spirited citizens of Clark County.

4. Credits earned at Clark Junior College are transferable. Thus two years of standardized college education are assured for the 450 graduates of Clark county high schools each year.

5. The drive for funds is endorsed by civic organizations, chamber of commerce, junior chamber of commerce, and Kiwanis club.

6. Money spent in support of Clark Junior College is a good investment. Fifty students going away to college take about \$30,000 with them out of this community. If this money stays here, every business concern will get a portion of it; if it goes away none of them will get any of it.
