## **Medical Assisting Standard Technical Requirements**

Physical and mental/emotional requirements: Medical Assistants are typically required to carry and lift up to 30 lbs., be on their feet for 8 h continuously, bend, reach and push carts with equipment for extended periods of time. Use hands for fine, repetitive manipulation of small objects and possess ability to utilize various medical equipment. MA's must have basic computer proficiency, keyboarding at 35 words per minute with 50 refever errors on a 5-minute timed test. MA's must possess excellent customers ervice and commications kills; have ability work in a fast-paced environment; work with diverse patient populations and maintain professional composure around patients that are sick and/or terminally ill.  Working conditions: positions in the hospital and/or clinical settings may require working flexible schedules, including nights, weekends, and holidays: potential exposure to chemical hazards; ability to wear gloves and other personal protective equipment (mask, coat, etc.) for extended periods of time. It is strongly recommended that all applicants closely observe the activities of those practicing in the profession to more fully understand the technical requirements of the program.  To participate in this program, students must be able to perform standard technical requirements as described above. Admission to the program be contingent upon the applicant verifying his or her ability to perform the established technical standards of the program with or with reasonable accommodation. Medical clearance by a healthcare professional is required. More details provided at orientation.  The program requires a 30 to 40 hour per week commitment from students for classes and clinical rotations (not including outside study time or travel time to the clinical ste). Reliable transportation is an important consideration as clinical facilities may require driving significant distances (up to approximately 50 miles distance from Clark).
