<input type="checkbox"/>	To apply to the program, complete the Clark College Application for Admission and the Pharmacy Technician Application . Return them to Clark College Enrollment Services with the non-refundable fees: \$25 for the admissions application fee for students new to Clark; \$50 for the program application fee (note: all fees subject to change). Date of Pharmacy Application (fee paid date) will be considered in selecting students for entry into the program. Eligible students may be included in the selection process a maximum of two times before they must reapply.								
<input type="checkbox"/>	Washington State Law [WAC 246-901-030(2)], requires that students have completed one of the following to be eligible for selection into the program: high school graduation, GED completion, or higher U.S. degree conferment. Students must attest that they have completed this requirement and explain how and when it was satisfied (application, page 2).								
<input type="checkbox"/>	The following courses or placement levels are required prior to program entry: MATH: Completion of MATH 092, BUS 102, PTCS 110, AH 103, or equivalent with a grade of "C" (2.0) or higher or eligibility for MATH 096. <i>(Must be 7 years current upon program entry).</i> WRITING: Completion of ENGL 098 or equivalent with a grade of "C" (2.0) or higher or eligibility for ENGL& 101.

Important Notes Regarding Program Acceptance

- Students are ranked by application date, so it is important to apply early, even if you have not completed the minimum requirements! With an active application, you will be tracked quarterly and pulled into selection as soon as you qualify.
- Students enrolled in clinical courses are required to complete a comprehensive Criminal Background Check (as required by the clinical sites). Students should be aware that the clinical site may deny the student access and the student may not be able to complete their healthcare program based on the results of the background check.
- In order to participate in the clinical externship, clinical sites may require any of the following; proof of current immunizations, additional background check, and drug screening. In order to complete the Hepatitis B series and titer prior to your clinical externship, it must be started a minimum of seven months in advance.
- Students may be required to complete a drug screen before beginning their clinical experience at the request of the clinical site. Drug screening costs are the responsibility of the student (approximately \$37). If the clinical site finds the student's drug screen to be unsatisfactory, the student may be dismissed from the program (see substance abuse policy on the Pharmacy Technician website).
- Health Insurance - Proof of health insurance may be required by the clinical site. Keep in mind that you are responsible for your own health and testing requirements should an accident or injury occur. Clinical sites are not responsible for any injury that occurs during externship.
