Independent Study for Artists

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Course Description:

Experience the joys of watercolor in a positive atmosphere with the support and encouragement of fellow artists in this class. Explore your own projects, brush up on watercolor basics or learn some new and interesting techniques to add to your painting repertoire. Grow as an artist and creator. Be inspired and motivated by the creativity and talent of those around you. Prerequisite: a foundation in watercolor. Bring your favorite supplies. Any special supplies needed for class projects you wish to do will be discussed in class. No class 10/31.

Learning Outcomes: As a result of taking this course, students will:

- Work on their own projects as this is an independent study course
- Be inspired by the works and critiques of fellow artists
- Be given the opportunity to try new techniques in watercolor with the emphasis on color theory

Course Schedule:

Week 1: Sept 26

• Wet on wet tree paintings using analogous colors

Week 2: Oct 3

• Using primary colors, choose 3 elements from the following list to create a painting: rocks, trees, water, mountains, flowers, house or buildings

Week 3: Oct 10

• Creating cloudy skies using various techniques and colors

Week 4: Oct 17

• Creating a monotone painting with one bright color pop on an item in the painting

Week 5: Oct 24

• Discovering different color combinations to make skin tones for portraits

Week 6: Oct 31 *<u>NO CLASS*</u>

Week 7: Nov 7

• Using old paintings as collage material, create a painting from scraps

Week 8: Nov 14

• Creating paintings using favorite palettes and defining their relationship

Week 9: Nov 21

• Catch up time for projects and/or creating holiday cards

Week 10: Nov 28

• Artists' choice. Follow-ups, suggestions, and individual problem solving
