Course Description

Explore the world of non-fiction comics in this engaging, discussion-based reading group. Each week, you'll receive a short comic (10–20 pages) in PDF form, along with discussion questions and supplemental materials—such as interviews with the creators or articles that provide deeper context. Together, we'll explore a range of non-fiction comic genres, including graphic journalism, memoir, informational comics, and graphic medicine. No prior experience with comics is necessary—just curiosity and a willingness to explore stories told in ink and image.

Course Schedule

7/23 Week 1: Memoir

Reading: ???

We'll begin with autobiographical comics, exploring how artists depict personal experiences using visual storytelling. Topics may include memory, voice, and the use of metaphor or visual symbolism in recounting life events.

7/30 Week 2: Graphic Journalism

Reading: ???

We'll examine comics as a tool for reporting on current events or social issues. We'll discuss objectivity, voice, and the strengths/limits of comics journalism compared to traditional reporting.
