# Clark College Standard 2023-2024 Cost of Attendance

Federal Regulations require schools to establish a cost of attendance, or budget, which reflects the average cost of attending college. The cost of attendance is the basis of establishing a student's financial need, as it sets a limit on the total aid that a student may receive.

Clark College's standard cost of attendance is based on three terms of full-time enrollment in an Associate degree or certificate program. Costs are prorated for less than full-time enrollment. Costs are automatically adjusted for students accepted and enrolled in Clark College's Bachelor's of Applied Science degree programs.

Adjustments to the cost of attendance may be made on a case-by-case basis as needed for dependent care expenses or costs related to a student disability. Students may request consideration for an adjustment to their cost of attendance by contacting the Financial Aid Office.
