

INTERNATIONAL PEER MENTOR PROGRAM

{Volunteer Opportunity!}

Position Announcement:

The International Peer Mentor Program connects new international students with current Clark College students who are interested in helping international students in their Clark College and cultural transition. International Peer Mentors will help new international students acclimate to life at Clark College and in the U.S. during Orientation and by inviting them to activities and social events, introducing them to many of the College traditions such as sporting events, theatre productions, Spring Thing, International Education Week and the Sakura Festival. New international students will be assigned to an International Peer Mentor prior to the start of the quarter by the International Programs Office. Selected students will be assigned to groups consisting of approximately three to five international students. This one-year volunteer appointment is a great opportunity to build important intercultural leadership skills!

Mentor Selection Criteria:

- ✓ Ability to commit to a one (academic) year appointment
- ✓ Must have completed at least two quarters at Clark College
- ✓ Must be a current Clark College student enrolled in a minimum of 6 credits
- ✓ Must have a GPA of 2.5 or above
- ✓ Submit Two Recommendation Forms (can be from Clark College faculty or staff, employers, coaches,
- or minister for example. Recommendations may not be from the International Programs staff.)
 - ✓ Must interview with the International Programs Office
 - ✓ Must pass a criminal background check (conducted by Clark College)
- ✓ Mentors are required to attend a **one-week** training provided by International Programs <u>and</u> the **twoday** Orientation for new international students (make-up trainings are not available).

Mentoring Requirements & Responsibilities (You must be able to participate in the following activities):

- International Peer Mentor Training (September 2019, exact dates TBD)
- International Student Orientations (September 11-12, 2019, December 18-19, 2019 & March 25-26, 2020)
- Attend quarterly area excursions (ie: Multnomah Falls, Portland Saturday Market, OMSI)
- Attend all scheduled Peer Mentor meetings (dates & times are to be determined)
- Initiate and maintain contact with your group throughout the quarter (at least 3 times per quarter)
- Invite your partners to join you in campus and community activities throughout the quarter
- Maintain contact with the International Programs Office throughout the quarter and respond to monthly update request
- Complete a monthly time log to document time spent volunteering

Program Benefits: Develop leadership and cross-cultural communication skills, learn about other cultures, earn an Intercultural Leadership Certificate and references for future global leadership positions!
