

Enrollment at College Seen Topping 525

Freshman Enrollment Up 30 Per Cent from 1950; Evening Class to Start

Anticipated enrollment for the fall quarter at Clark college is expected to equal last year's figure of 527 full-time students and approximately an equal number of part-time students in evening classes, according to M. J. Greenshields, director of admissions at Clark.

The estimate is based on pre-enrollment of full-time students and the growing interest in evening classes which are for the first time scheduled for the same dates as the regular campus classes, Greenshields said. Pre-enrollment figures from the registrar's office show that to date 205 freshmen students have submitted credentials, about 30 per cent more than at the same time last year.

The traditional freshman assembly is set for Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock in the auditorium on the Fourth Plain campus. Master of ceremonies will be J. Manning Nelson, director of guidance. Following the get acquainted ceremonies, all newcomers will report to faculty advisors who will act as counselors during the coming year.

Registration begins on Wednesday and continues until noon Saturday. Classes for both full-time and evening students will begin on September 10.
