

Clark men beat Tacoma

Chapman, Adams lead Penguins to 94-81 home win over Titans

Two big efforts helped the Clark College men's basketball team to its first NWAACC West Division victory.

Kenny Chapman scored 32 points and pulled down 12 rebounds, and teammate Erving Adams had 13 points, 16 rebounds and eight assists as the Penguins beat Tacoma 94-81 on Saturday at the O'Connell Center.

The Penguins (3-12, 1-3) pulled away in the second half, outscoring the Titans 49-37.

Chapman made 12 of 17 shots and 8 of 9 free throws.

Josias Flynn added 18 points, and Drew Bleth had 10 points for Clark, which shot 53.8 percent for the game.

"It was a good team win," Clark coach Mike Arnold said. "We've been working on our execution of things and where the shots come from and being in position."

Tacoma's Chris Chase came off the bench to lead all scorers with 35 points.

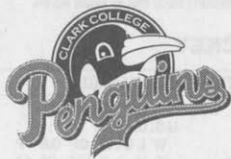

Maryam Razavi scored 22 points and pulled down 14 rebounds to help the Penguins defeat the Titans at the O'Connell Center.

Clark (6-11, 2-2) also got 20 points from Hudson's Bay graduate Stephanie Woullard, and 11 points and eight rebounds off the bench from Ridgefield alumna Brooke Lowery.

"It was not easy," Penguins coach Aaron Christian said. "We had to grind it out, but that's good."

In the final seconds, the Titans (3-8, 1-3) missed a potentially tying 3-pointer, and Clark rebounded.

The Penguins earned a 42-37 edge in rebounding, largely on the strength of 17 offensive boards.

Washougal product Danette Bergerson had six of her nine rebounds at the offensive end.
