

Multi-event Clark athletes place

Mike Rush of Clark College finished third in the men's decathlon, and the Penguins' **Lindsey Buttrey** placed fourth in the women's heptathlon at the NWAACC Championships.

Competition in the decathlon and heptathlon for Northwest community colleges was held Monday and Tuesday at Lane Community College in Eugene.

Rush had the best marks among the eight decathlon competitors in the high jump (6 feet) and the 400 meters (52.78 seconds) and finished with 5,286 points. Collin Cram from Lane won the decathlon with 6,551 points. Clark's **Matt Perrow** was seventh with 4,092 points.

In the heptathlon, Buttrey won the long jump with a mark of 16 feet, 6¾ inches. She finished second in the 200 with a time of 26.66. **Kimberly Pence** of Clark finished seventh among the 10 women in

the heptathlon with a score of 3,288.

The NWAACC heptathlon and decathlon meet is held separate from the conference championships, though points from the multi-event competition count in team scoring for the NWAACC championships, which are scheduled for May 22-23 at Spokane Falls Community College.

Clark hosts its annual home meet, the Roy Burns Invitational, on Saturday. Field events begin at 11 a.m., and track events at noon.
