

Clark College will host regional workshop for medical technology

Next month Clark College's nationally recognized nursing program will host a seminar for healthcare professionals and specialists on "simulation."

Simulation is state-of-the-art technology that allows healthcare professionals, specialists and students to gain experience by working on lifelike electronic mannequins of adults and infants.

The workshop will be held from Aug. 8 through 10, at the Clark Center at Washington State University Vancouver. The Clark Center houses Clark College's nursing program. WSU Vancouver is located at 14204 N.E. Salmon Creek Ave., Vancouver.

The workshop is designed for healthcare clinical educators, healthcare specialists and clinical experts, allied

health faculty, chairs, directors, deans and administrators.

Participants will experience running simulators with the support of clinical simulation experts. They will tour a state-of-the-art simulation lab, view simulation in action with students, learn how simulation can make a difference in an organization, and learn tips on how to start a simulation program.

The workshop will be facilitated by Shelly Quint, RN, MS, Director of Nursing for Clark College, and Rosemary Sievila, RN, MS, Nursing Faculty at Clark College.
