

Westbrooks helps lead Clark to tourney title

Prairie grad named MVP of Clackamas Crossover event

Orlandor Westbrooks capped a big weekend with a big game Sunday as the Clark College men's basketball team beat Skagit Valley in overtime to win the Clackamas Crossover Tournament championship.

Westbrooks, a freshman from Prairie High School, scored 30 points in the 92-80 win. He had 29 points on Saturday, when the Penguins defeated host Clackamas in the tournament semifinals.

Westbrooks had 80 points in three tournament games, and was named the MVP of the tournament in Oregon City, Ore.

Clark (7-4) outscored Skagit Valley 18-6 in overtime to earn the win.

"Part of that was just being a little stronger with the ball," Clark coach Mike Arnold said of his team's advantage in overtime. "And we made our free

throws."

Westbrooks hit 4 of 5 from 3-point range. He was 10 for 20 from the field and 6 for 7 from the foul line.

Tommy Allen, who also was named to the all-tournament team, had 12 points, four rebounds and four assists on Sunday. The Penguins had assists on 20 of their 28 field goals. Mike Rush had a team-high eight rebounds.

"We learned a lot this weekend because we played three very good teams," Arnold said.

Clark next plays host to the annual Talbitzer Homes Holiday Tournament Dec. 27-29 at the O'Connell Center.
