### **Eastern to offer social work programs at Clark College**

Earning a bachelor's or master's degree in social work just got a bit more convenient for Clark County residents.

Eastern Washington University and Clark College have agreed to offer Eastern's social work programs at Clark. Instead of traveling to Spokane for classes, students will meet one afternoon and evening each week at Clark. Classes will be taught by an Eastern faculty member.

Details will be aired at a 6 p.m. meeting Wednesday in Room 250 of Joan Stout Hall, which is at East McLoughlin Boulevard and E. Reserve Street.

People with at least a bachelor's but less than a master's often work as child, family and school social workers; medical and public health social workers; and as probation officers and correctional treatment specialists. Officials predict 45 such positions to open annually in Southwest Washington.
