

Titans too much for Clark men

The division-leading Tacoma Titans shot 57 percent Saturday and beat visiting Clark College 86-61 in a Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges men's basketball game.

Ryan Anderson scored 14 points to lead the Penguins, and Grant Ziegler added 13. Clark shot only 36 percent from the field and trailed by 18 points at halftime.

"We didn't come out flat like the last few games, but we just didn't make our shots," coach Mike Arnold said. "We were in scramble mode."

The Penguins fell to 5-10 on the season, 3-4 in NWAACC West Division play.

All 11 players scored for the third-ranked Titans (14-2, 6-1), led by 16 points from Darius Walker.

Pierce (10-7, 4-3) visits the Clark men for an 8 p.m. game on Wednesday.

Clark women 74, Tacoma 69 — Renee Tzeo scored 27 points to lead the Penguins to the road win. She made all 10 of her free throws, on a day Clark was 22 of 25 from the foul line.

Clark (8-6, 5-2 NWAACC West) won despite turning over the ball 34 times.

Chawncy McClenan had 15 points and Chelsea Dyson added 13 for the Penguins, who led by as many as 17 points in the second half.

Clark will host Pierce at 6 p.m. on Wednesday.
