1. Attend every class.
2. Go early and stay until the end.

14. Carry note cards for formulas and key words with you.
15. Make up sample tests and pretest yourself.
16. Set goals and daily priorities. Do first things first.
17. Turn in all assignments on time. Do extra credit work.
18. Create an organized, well-lit, and quiet study space.
19. Eat healthy foods, exercise, get enough rest, and avoid drugs.
20. Study when you are most alert.
21. Adapt to your instructor's teaching style.
22. Integrate learning styles. Make learning physical and personal.
23. Practice speeches until you are comfortable and confident.
24. Use peer revision on term papers. Proofread several times.
25. Neatness counts. Focus on details of papers.

27. Value and develop positive personal qualities.

29. Keep a journal and write letters to improve your writing skills.
30. Be tolerant of others.

33. Make questions out of chapter headings. Read chapter summaries.
34. Use waiting time for reviewing notes and using note cards.
35. Read standing up. Read out loud. Summarize your reading.
36. Welcome feedback and use it to monitor your results.
37. Ask for help early.
38. Connect patterns, link concepts, and look for relationships.
39. Summarize chapters in your own words. Recite out loud.
40. Use listening and good communication skills to build rapport.
41. Take time to explore campus and community resources.
42. Know the course objectives and the instructor's expectations.
43. Anticipate questions and ask why. Good questions deserve good answers.
44. Make information personal and applicable.
45. Focus on the present and absorb yourself in the moment.
46. Surround yourself with students who are motivated.
