As a Law Enforcement Officer for more than 25 years I have had a range of experience working with community members including those living on the streets. For the year of 2015, I also served on Share's board and had a bird's eye view of how issues around homelessness were seen from their perspective. 2015 also brought a significant amount of public awareness to the issue of homelessness, as the number of people visibly living on the streets escalated.

My work, has given me many opportunities to see a variety of struggles that can largely remain hidden from the general public.
