Clinicians

April Brookins Duvic joined the music faculty at Clark College in Vancouver, WA in 1990; teaching Applied Voice, Music Education and Music Appreciation classes as well as directing the College's three choirs prior to her retirement in June 2016. She created and initiated this annual choral festival as part of her work at Clark. She was the first two-time recipient of the College's Exceptional Faculty Award (2001 & 2007). She is an active member of the National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS), the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA), and the Music Teachers National Association (MTNA.) Ms. Duvic is a frequent adjudicator for both choral and solo vocal competitions and master classes in Oregon and Washington. Active in musical theatre at Clark College and in the Portland/Vancouver area, Ms. Duvic received awards for her musical direction of *Evita*, *West Side Story*, and *Guys and Dolls*. Her most recent musical direction was *bare* in 2020, which marked her 19th production at Clark College. Ms. Duvic co-directs Reprise Choir, a Vancouver, WA-based community choir, which she co-founded in 2016. (www.reprisechoirsings.org) Ms. Duvic earned her Bachelor of Arts in Music from Whitman College and her Master of Science in Teaching from Portland State University.

Wallace Long, Jr. retired in Spring 2020 from his position as director of choral/vocal activities at Willamette University in Salem, Oregon, a position he had held since 1983. Dr. Long founded the Willamette Master Chorus in 1985 and was its director for the first thirteen years of its existence. Dr. Long sang professionally with Male Ensemble Northwest and has performed as a member of the Oregon Bach Festival Chorus, and the Festival Singers of the Robert Shaw Choral Institute. Groups under his direction have performed for state conferences of the Oregon Music Educators Association, Northwestern Regional Conventions for the American Choral Directors association, national conventions of the International Association of Jazz Educators, and the Music Educators National Conference. In the summer of 2003 his Willamette University Chamber Choir participated in a performance tour of South Africa at the request of Archbishop Desmond Tutu. In May of 2006 he conducted a 250-voice choir and professional orchestra in a performance of the Haydn's Mass in the Time of War in Carnegie Hall. Several members of the Willamette Master Chorus and Chamber Choir joined him for this special performance. A frequent vocal/choral adjudicator, clinician and guest conductor, he is an active supporter of public school music in the northwest and has conducted honor choirs in Montana, Wyoming, Kansas, Oregon, Washington, Alaska, Texas, Ireland, and Thailand.

Chris Maunu is the artistic director of the Pacific Youth Choir, in Portland. He spent the previous 17 years as the Director of Choral Activities at Arvada West High School in Colorado and 7 years as Co-Artistic Director of the professional Anima Chamber Ensemble. A 4-time Finalist for the GRAMMY® Music Educator of the Year Award and 2-time winner of the CMA National Music Teacher of Excellence Award, Chris is a passionate advocate for music education. Maunu has enjoyed serving as a guest clinician for all state and festival choirs from Hawaii to England and many areas in between. He is a contributing author to “The Choral Conductor’s Companion,” published by GIA, as well as having had numerous articles appear in the Choral Journal and other publications. In addition, Maunu maintains an active composing career. Chris holds a Master of Music degree from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and a Bachelor of Music Education from Northern State University.

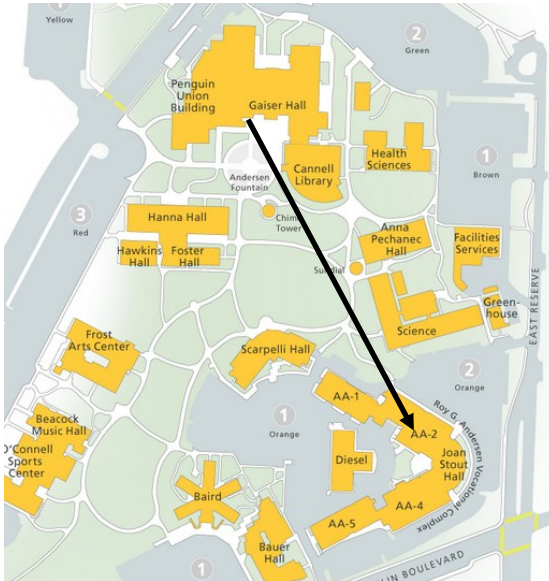
Mike Scott was born at a very young age and is a distinguished performer, adjudicator, and educator with over 30 years of experience in singing and music performance. He is widely regarded as one of the leading music educators in the Pacific Northwest. Currently, in his role as the Director of Choral Activities, Mike oversees the choral programs at Columbia Basin College. He possesses a wealth of experience in teaching various vocal and instrumental ensembles, ranging from middle school to college level, and has assumed various leadership roles within his educational institutions. Notably, he has also served on the Washington ACDA board and currently serves on the Northwest ACDA board, all while juggling a demanding adjudication and retreat clinician schedule and his busy family schedule with his wife, Angela, their children Penny and Ollie, their beloved old lady cat Agnes, and their goldendoodle sweetheart, Phyllis. Of all the festivals Mike has adjudicated, The Clark College Fall Choral Festival is definitely one of them.

Festival History—Celebrating our 10th Festival

Back in the fall of 2012, Clark’s then Director of Choirs April Brookins Duvic designed the first Annual Clark College Choral Festival. Festival Director

Dr. Jacob Funk serves as the Director of Choirs at Clark College, where he conducts three ensembles and teaches courses in music theory, ear training, music appreciation, rock history, and applied voice. In recognition of his outstanding teaching and mentorship, Dr. Funk was honored with the 2022–2023 Clark College Exceptional Faculty Award, presented at the June 2023 Commencement. Dr. Funk earned his Doctor of Musical Arts in Conducting from the University of Missouri–Kansas City Conservatory of Music and Dance, where he served as a Graduate Assistant in the Choral Department, Associate Conductor of the Conservatory Concert Choir, and co-conductor of the University Singers. Before joining Clark College, Dr. Funk taught vocal music for grades 5–12, served on the faculties of John Brown University and Northwest Arkansas Community College, and held positions in church music as a choirmaster and section leader. An active member of the choral community, he is a former Two-Year College Repertoire and Resources Chair for the Washington chapter of the American Choral Directors Association and frequently leads workshops and clinics with choirs throughout the Vancouver and Portland area.

Piano Faculty

A native of South Korea, **Dr. Jeongmi Yoon** is a pianist, educator, and adjudicator. As a soloist, collaborative pianist, and chamber musician, she has performed in numerous cities within the United States, China, and South Korea. Dr. Yoon received her Doctor of Musical Arts in Piano Performance from the University of North Texas, where she held both Teaching Assistant and Fellow positions, while studying under Joseph Banowetz. She holds a Master of Music in Piano Performance from Portland State University and a Bachelor of Music from Chonnam National University in South Korea. Currently, Dr. Yoon serves on the faculties at the University of Portland and Clark College.
