Tobacco Free Campus

Policy

Clark College supports findings from the Surgeon General that any form of tobacco use is a health hazard, including but not limited to: cigarettes and chewing tobacco.

E-Cigarette use is also not permitted on campus.

The College recognizes that environmental tobacco smoke is a carcinogen.

Tobacco use is not permitted on campus. This includes college sidewalks, parking lots, landscaped areas, recreational areas and buildings on college property.

Tobacco products must be extinguished or disposed of before entering campus or exiting your vehicle.

Tobacco use on campus or improper disposal of such products can result in a \$20.00 fine or disciplinary action.

Responsibilities

If you find someone in violation of the tobacco policy, use one of these phrases to start a conversation:

Did you know that we have a tobacco policy?

Did you know that there is a fine for tobacco products on campus?

Did you know that the fine for littering is \$500 in Washington state?

Rights

It is not a violation of the tobacco policy if you are:

In possession of tobacco products on campus, but not using them.

Using tobacco products on city perimeter sidewalks.

Using tobacco products more than 25 feet from a bus stop.
