

Guided Pathways is simply a college framework that is geared toward providing students with clear program options, an understanding of how to identify the best option(s) for them, support to develop a comprehensive plan for completion, tools for addressing and resolving any challenges along the way, and imbedded outcomes assessment. Internally, it's a vehicle for collaboration between departments toward student outcome goals.
