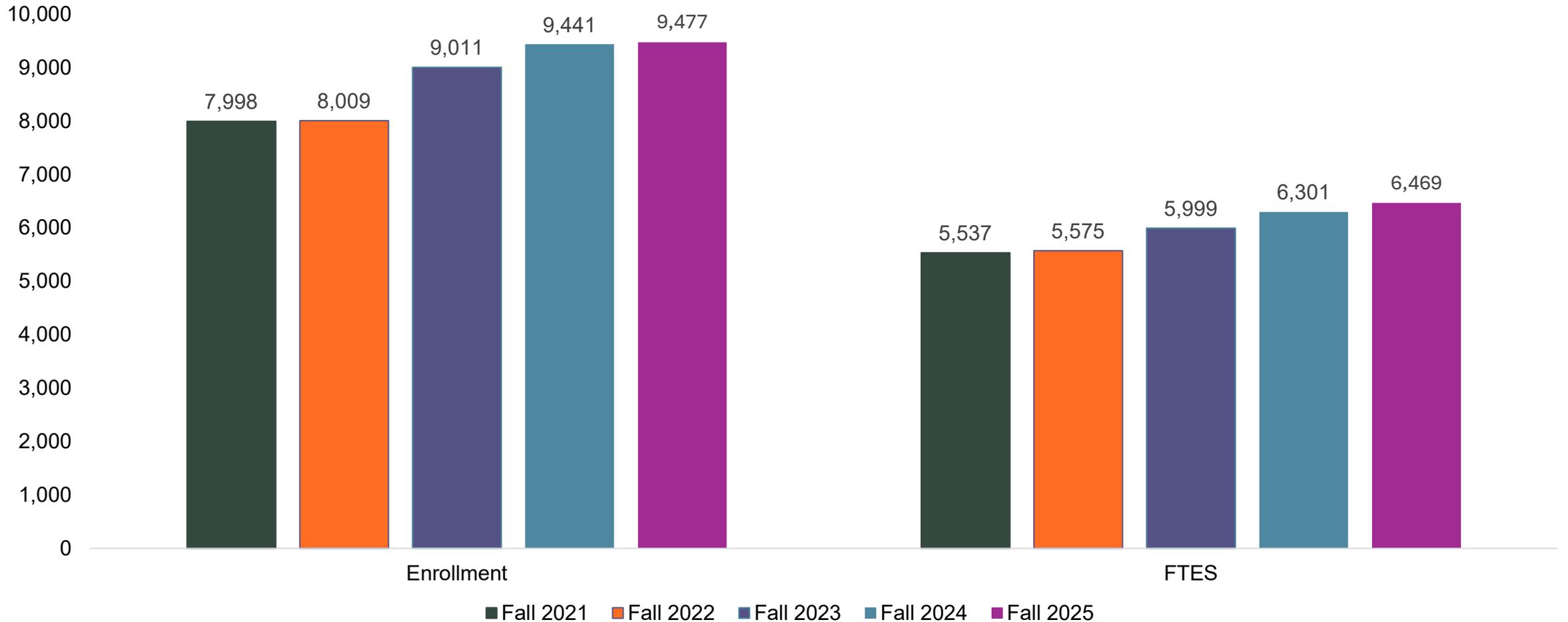

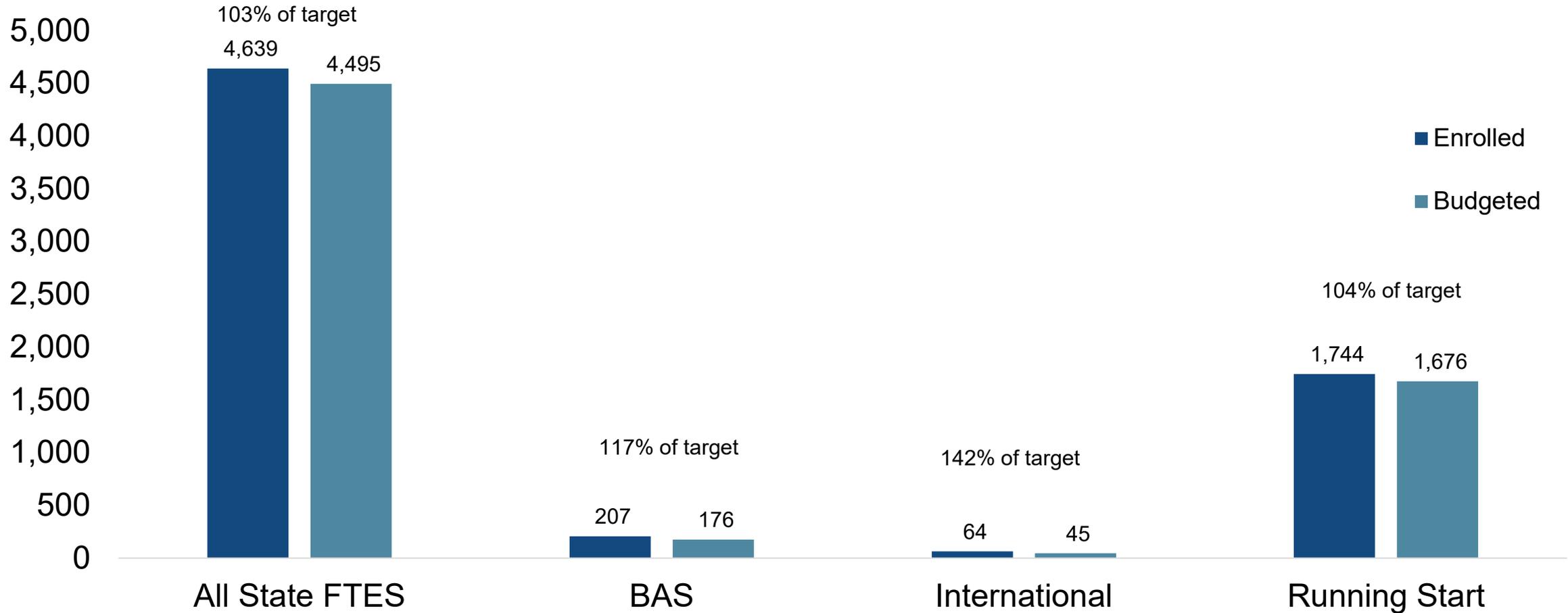

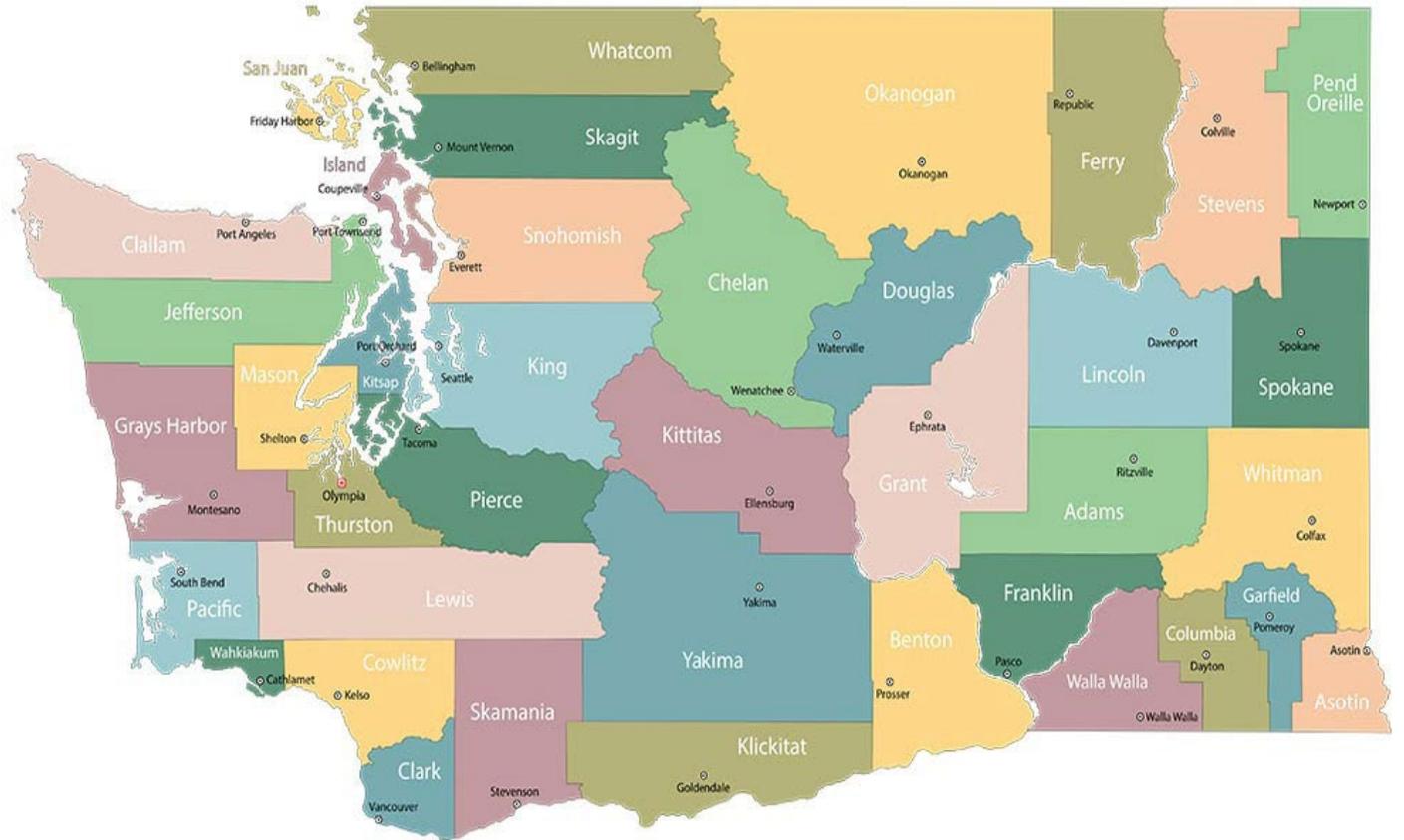

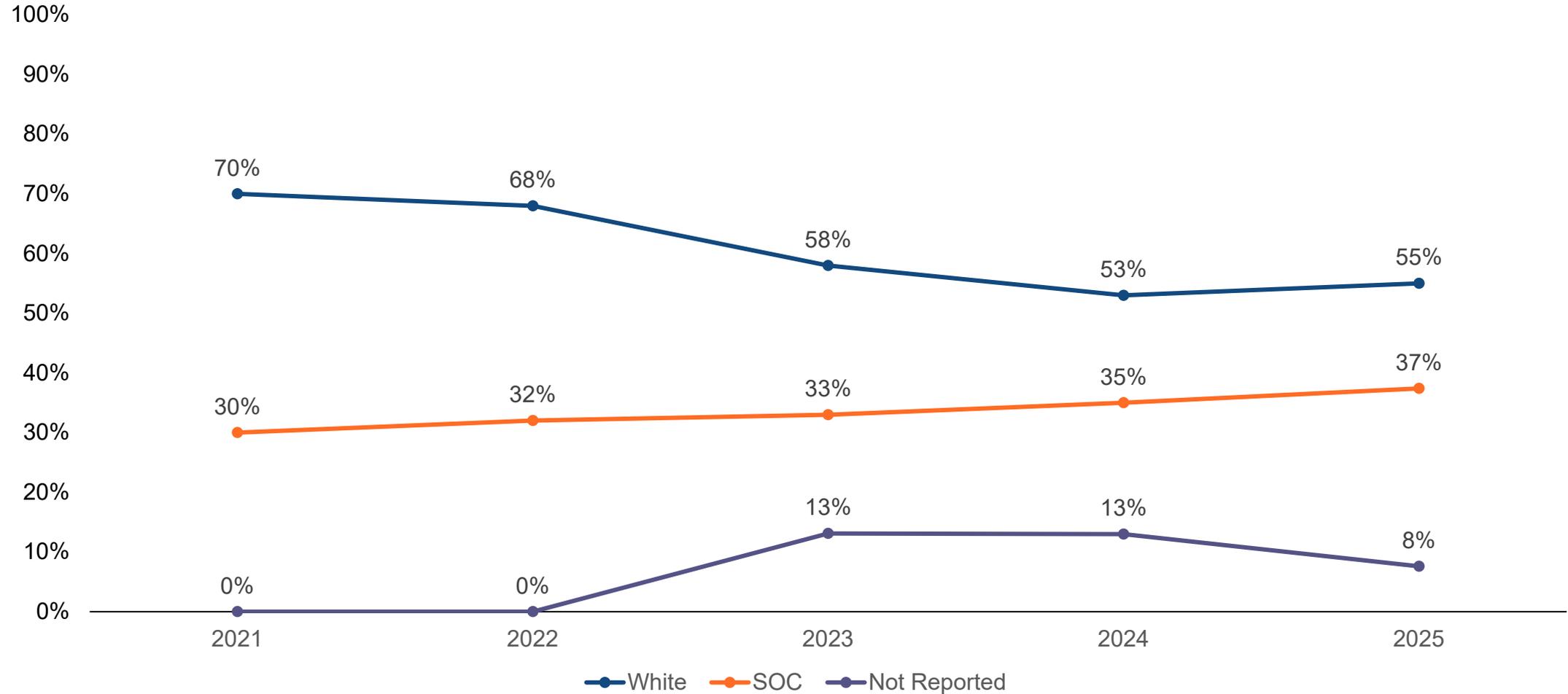

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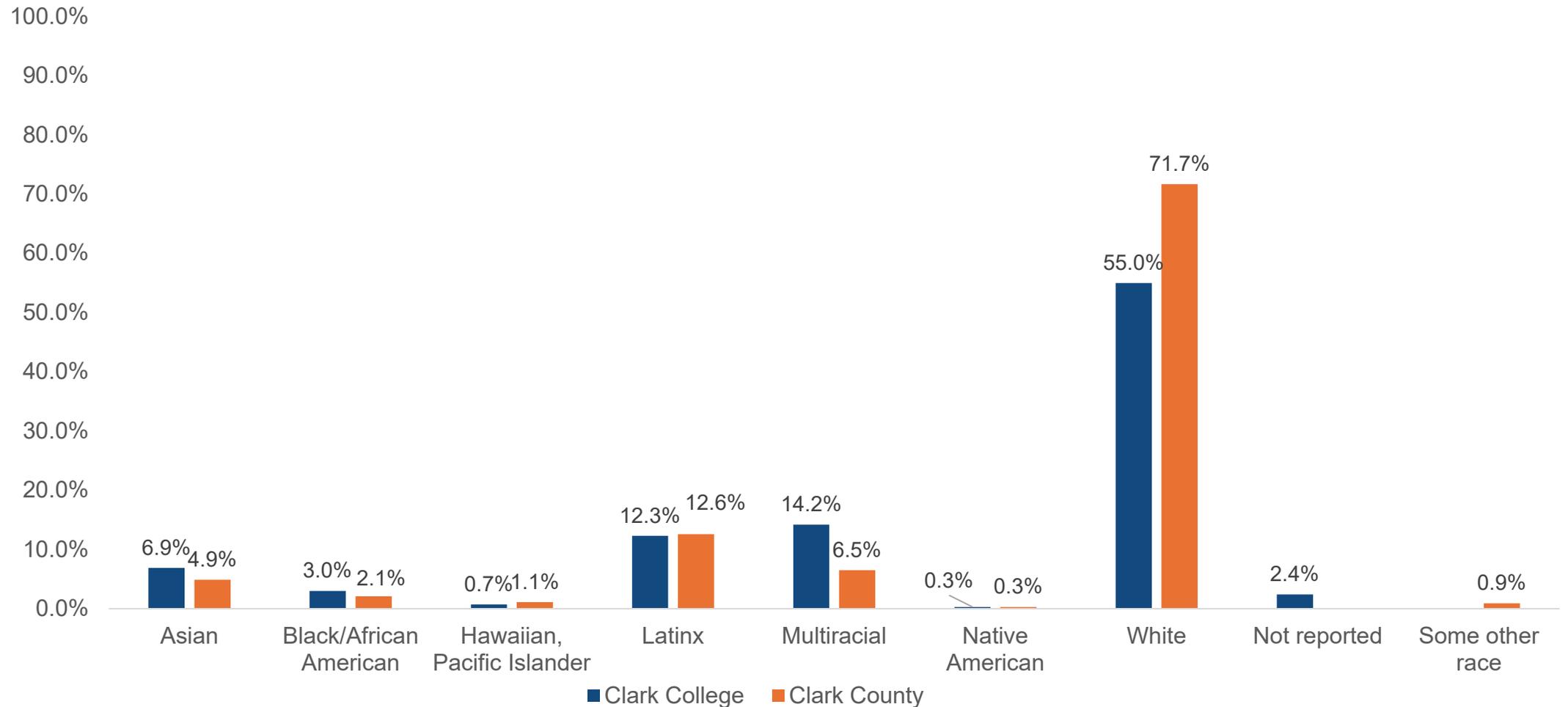
# Enrollment Trends of Students of Color as Compared to White Students, Fall 2021-2025



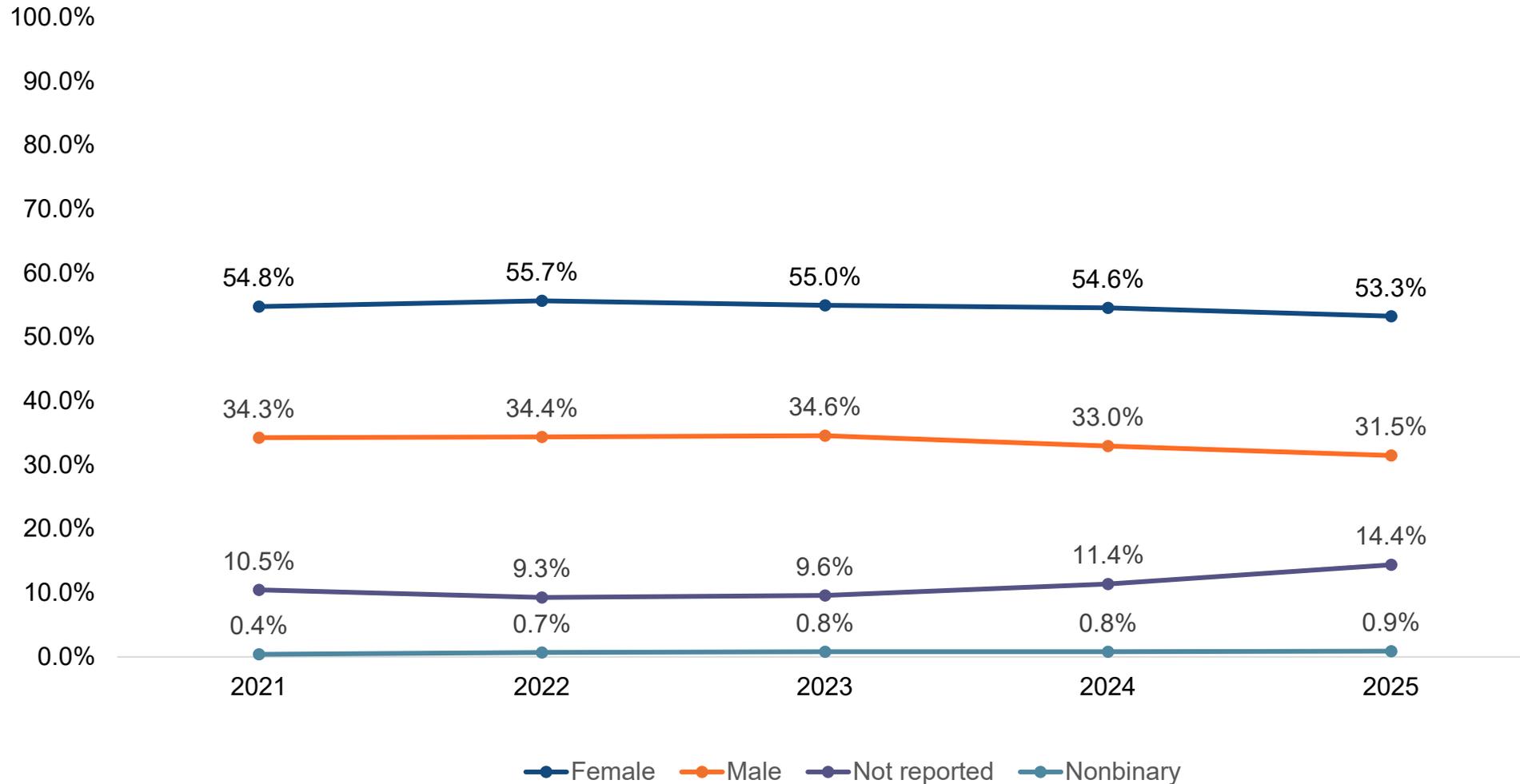

# Race/Ethnicity of Clark Students Compared to Clark County, Fall 2025

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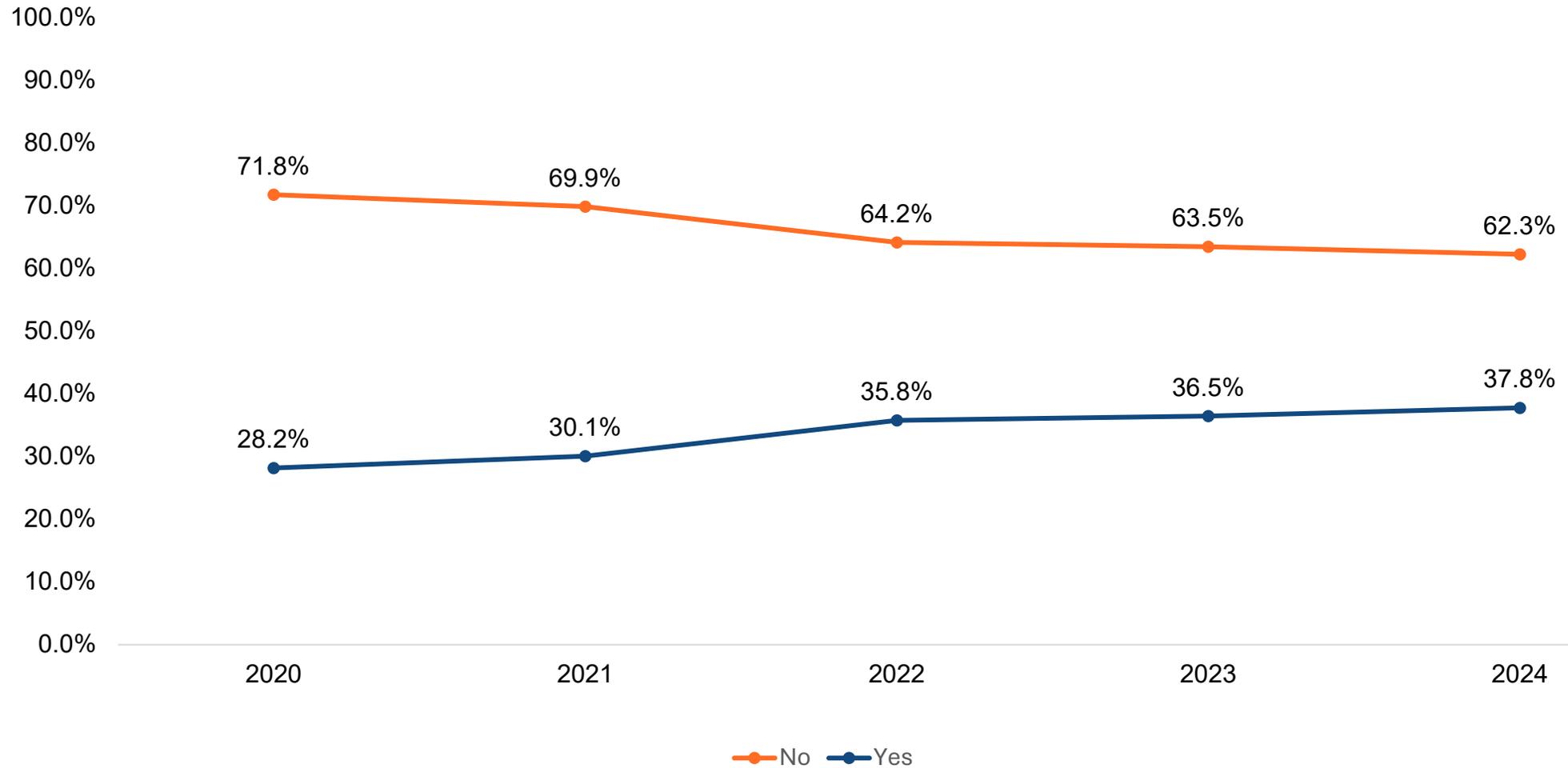


# Sex of Clark Students, Fall 2021-2025

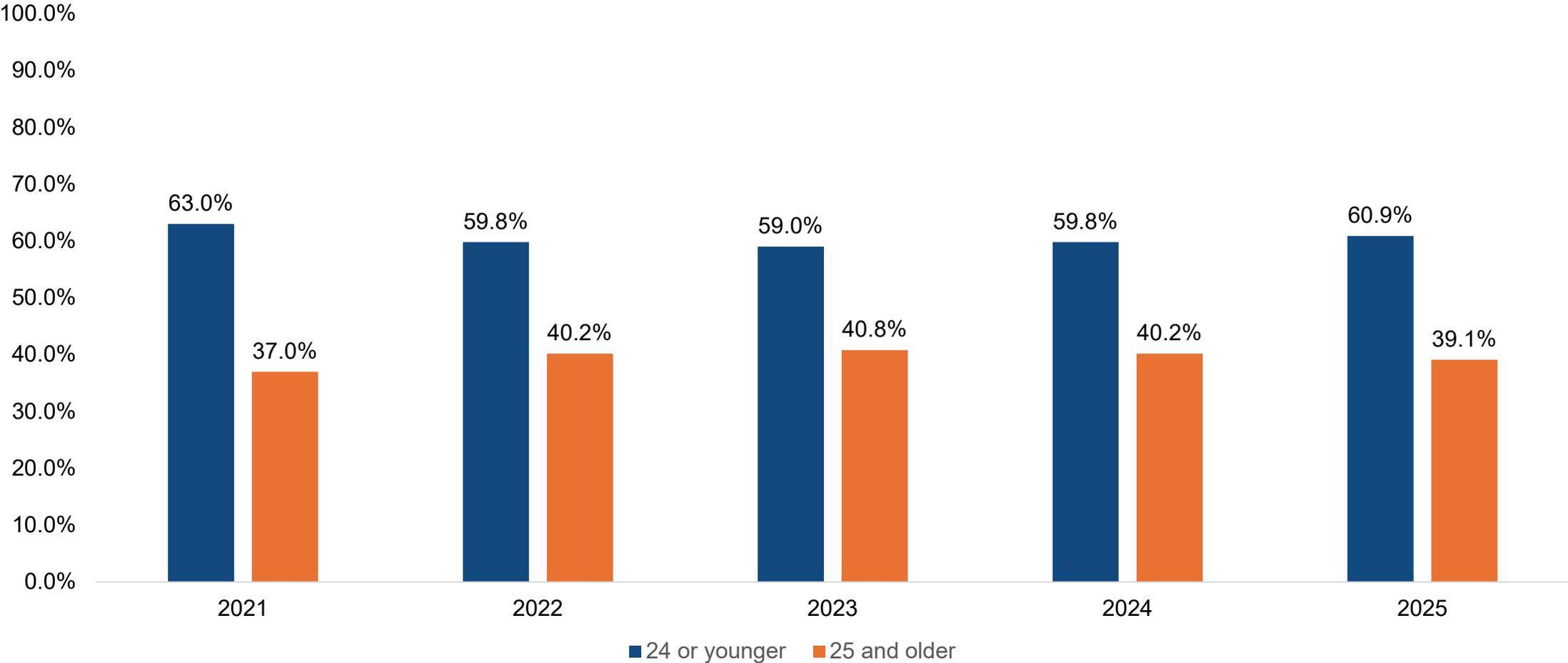


# Clark Students Classified as Economically Disadvantaged, Fall 2020-2024

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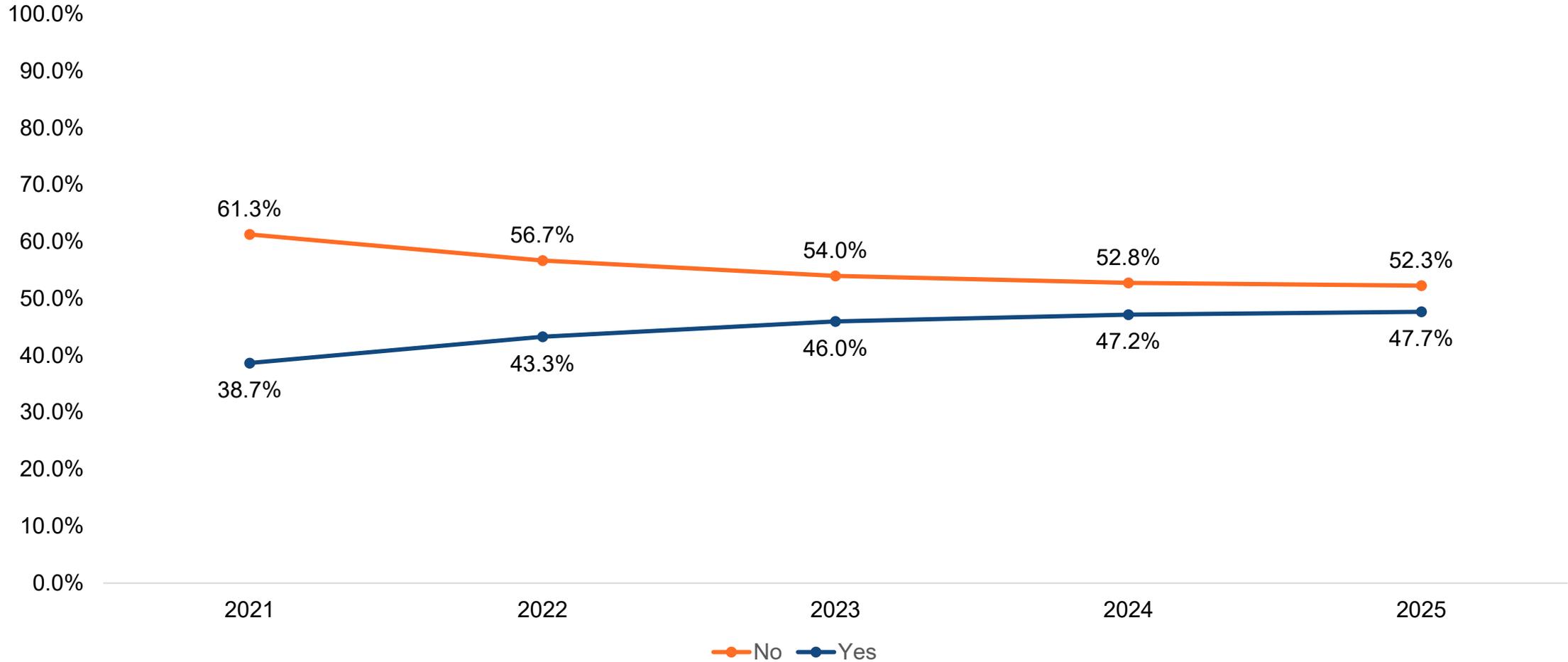
# Age Group of Clark Students, Fall 2021-2025

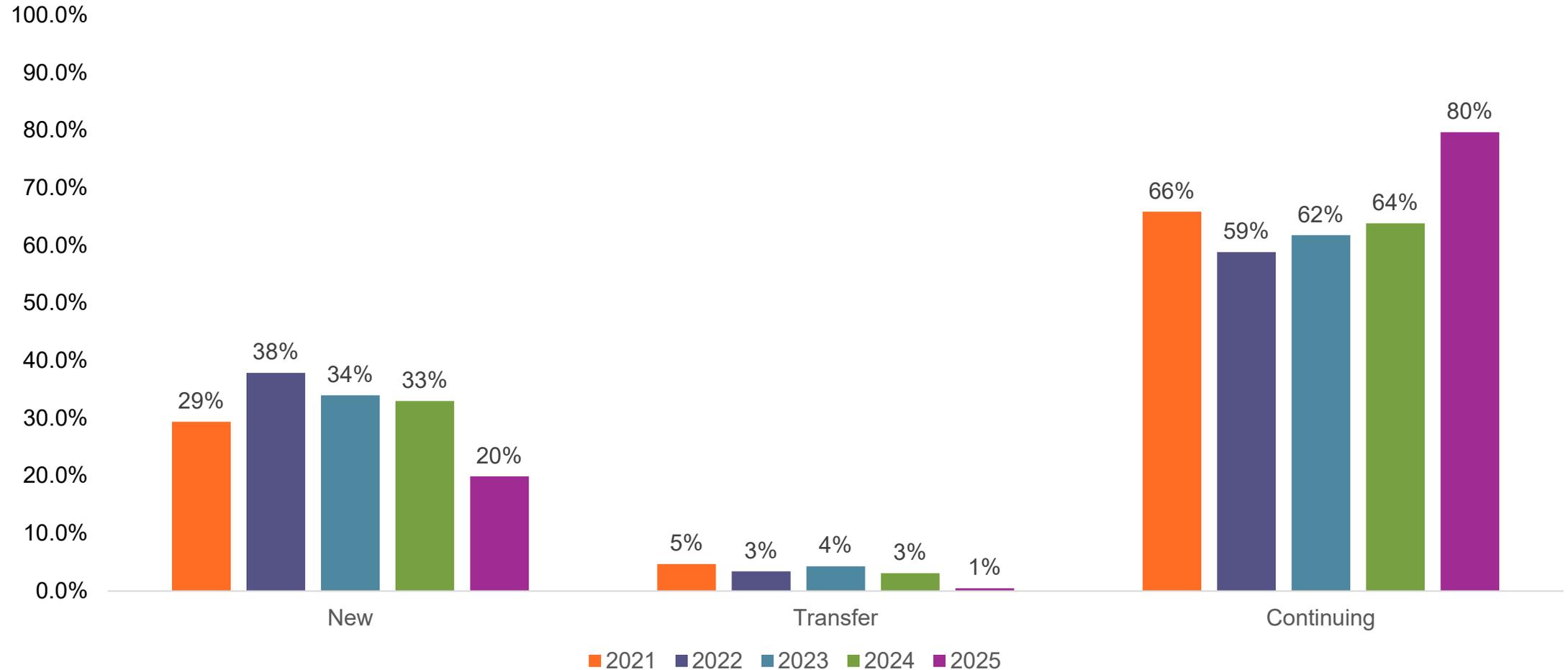
# First Generation Status of Clark Students, Fall 2021-2025

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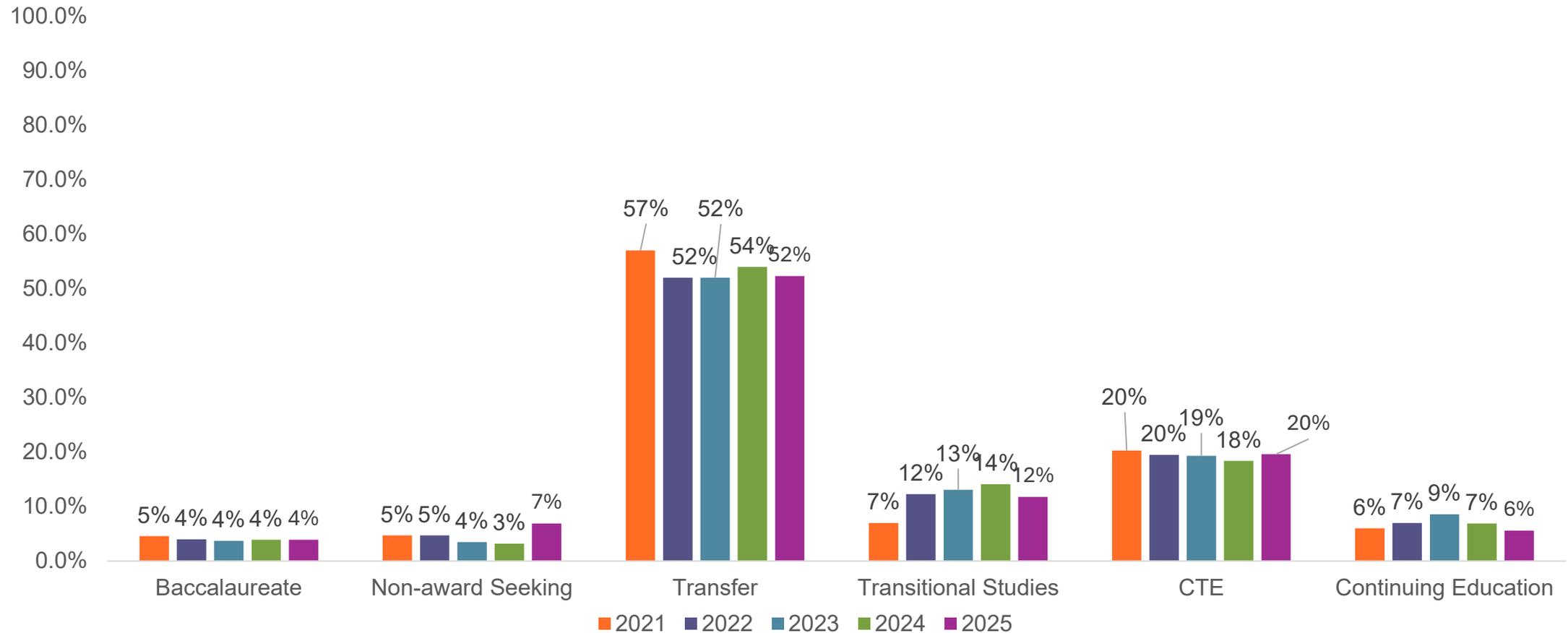

# Computer & Electronics & Software: Fall 2024 Enrollment Overall and in the Cybersecurity and Network Technology Programs by Race/Ethnicity



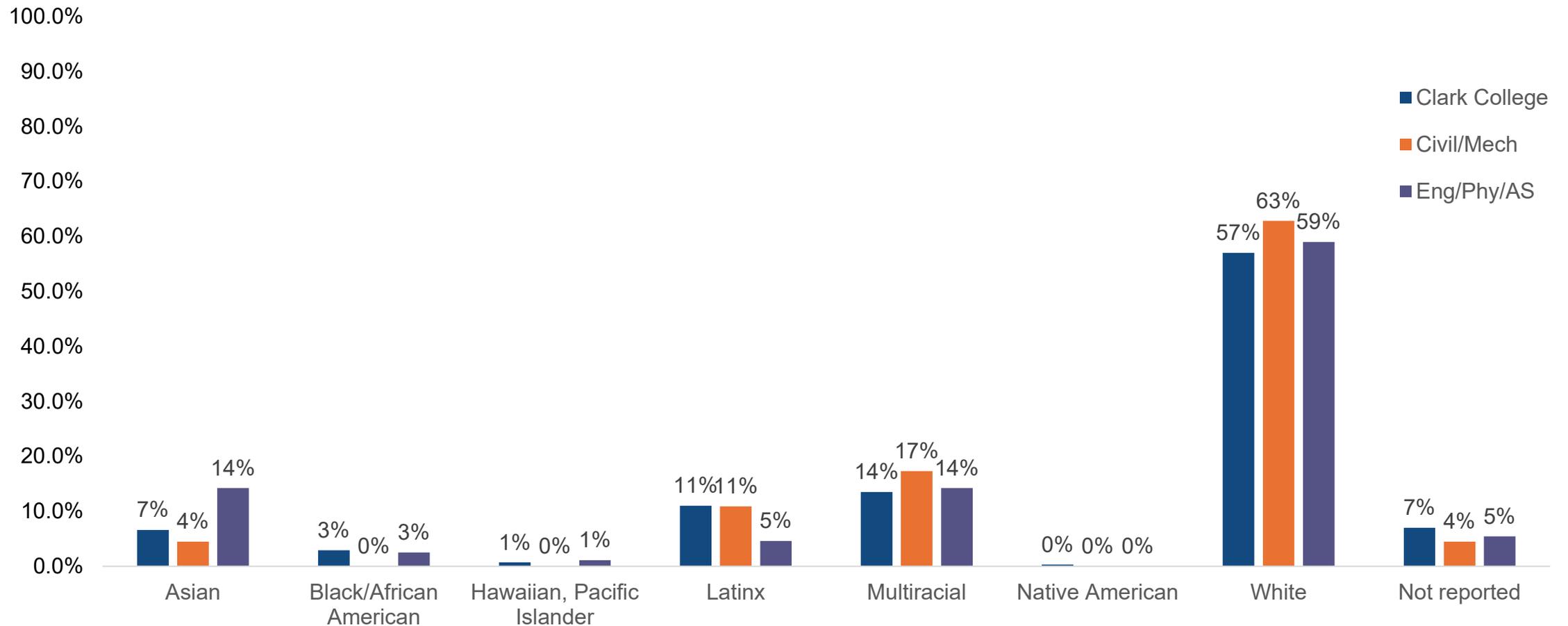

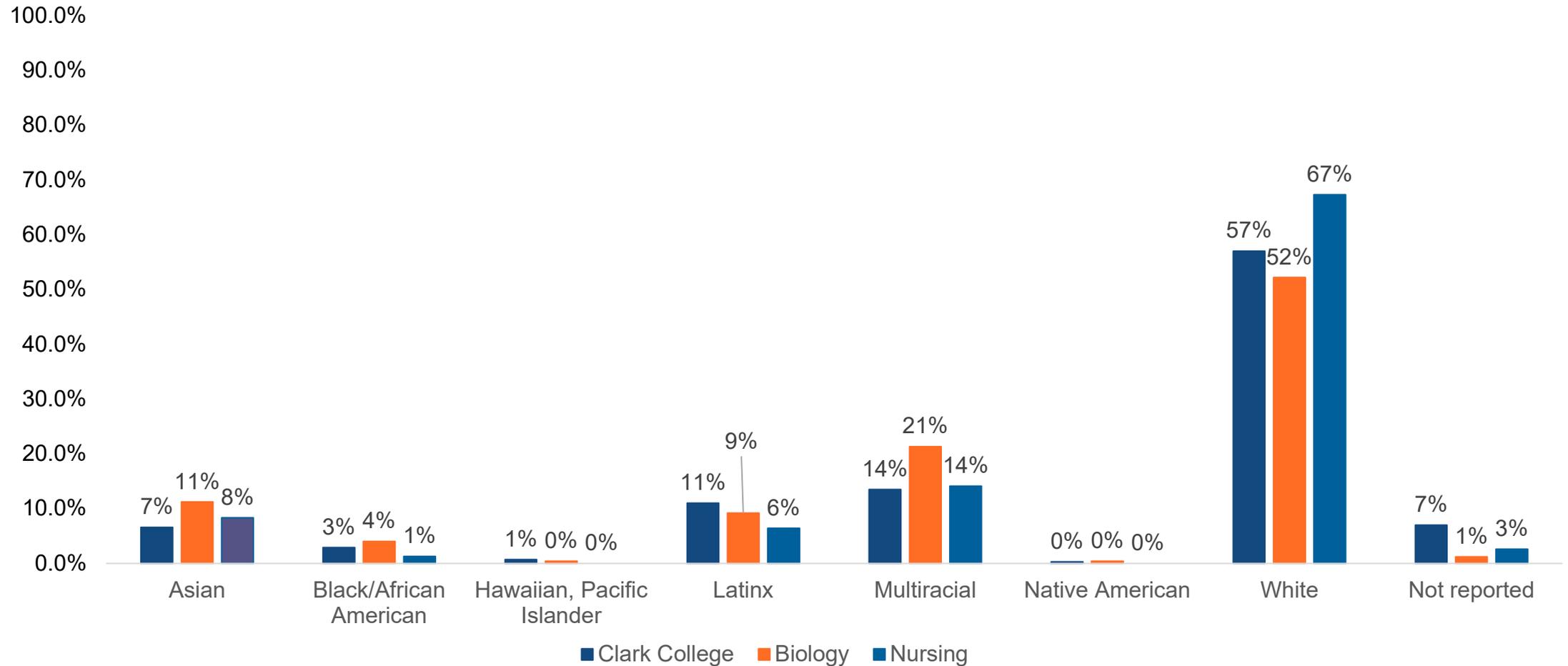

# Health Care/Life Sciences: Fall 2024 Enrollment Overall and in the Nursing and Biology Programs by Race/Ethnicity



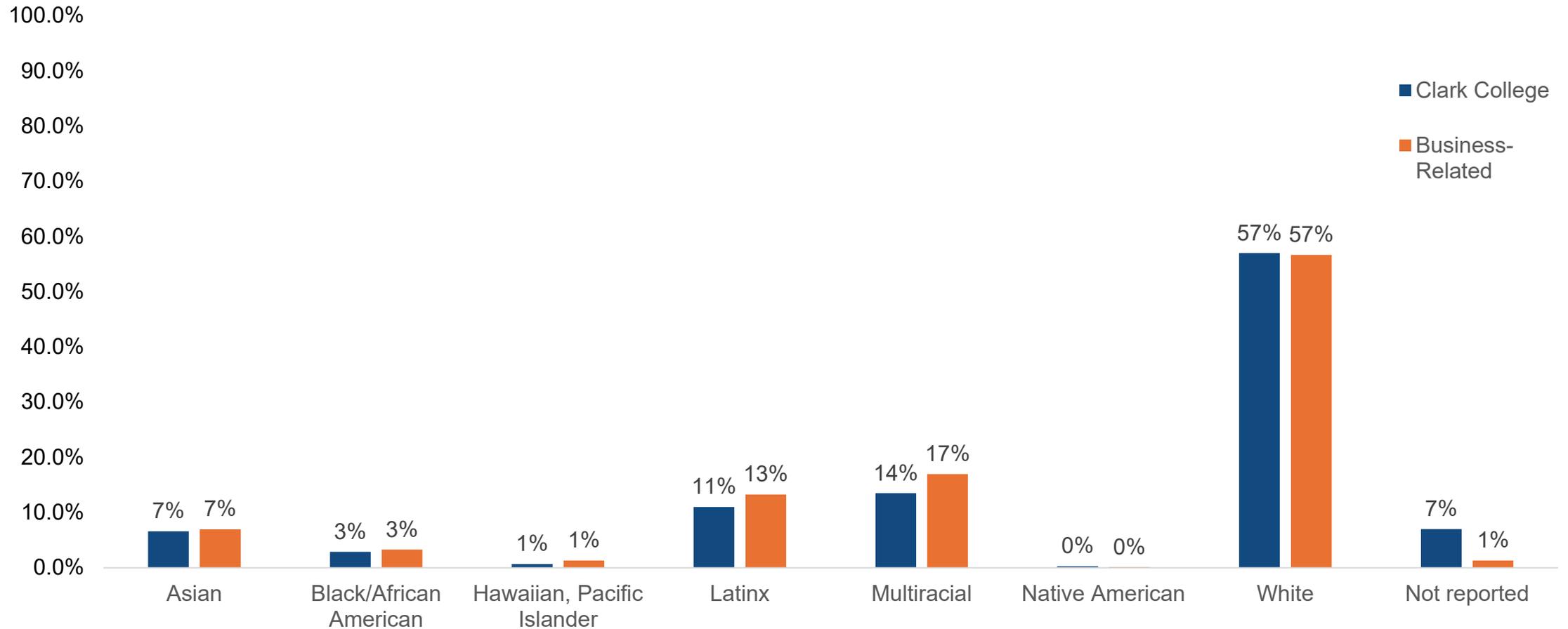

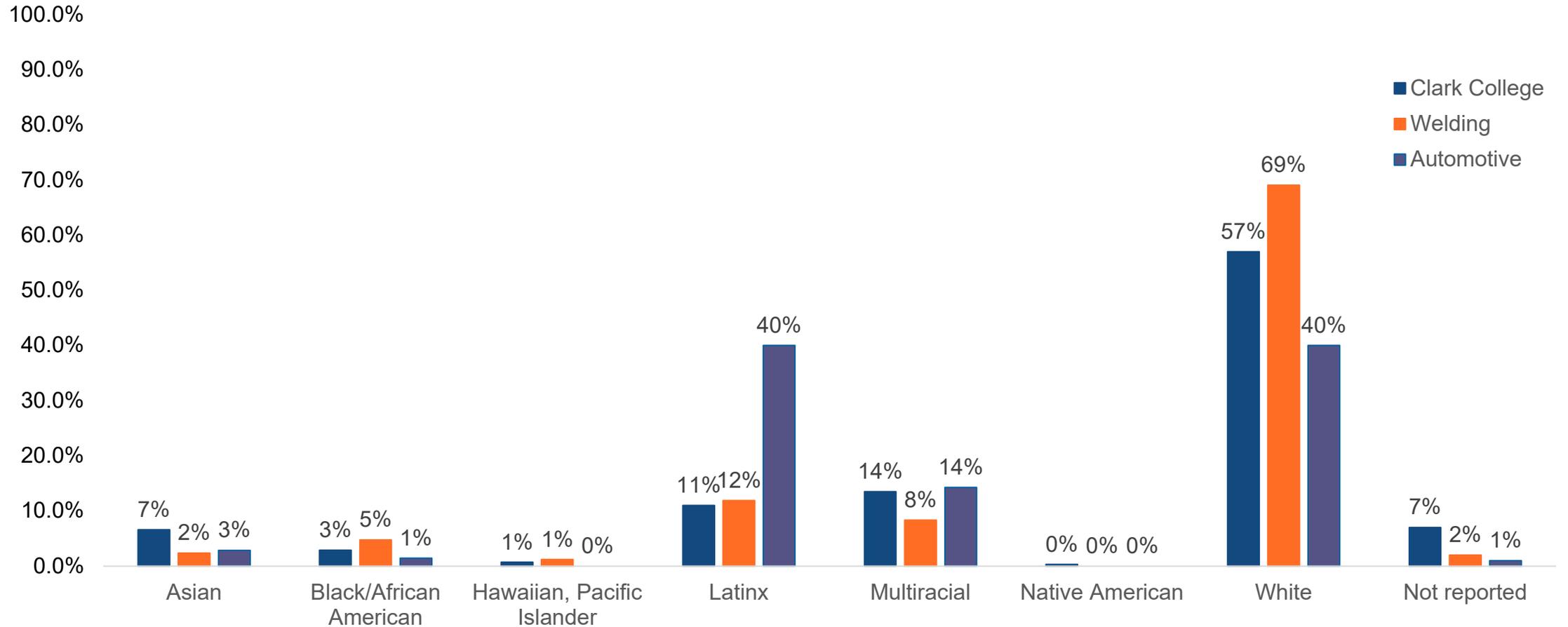

# Trades: Fall 2024 Enrollment Overall and in the Welding and Automotive Programs by Race/Ethnicity



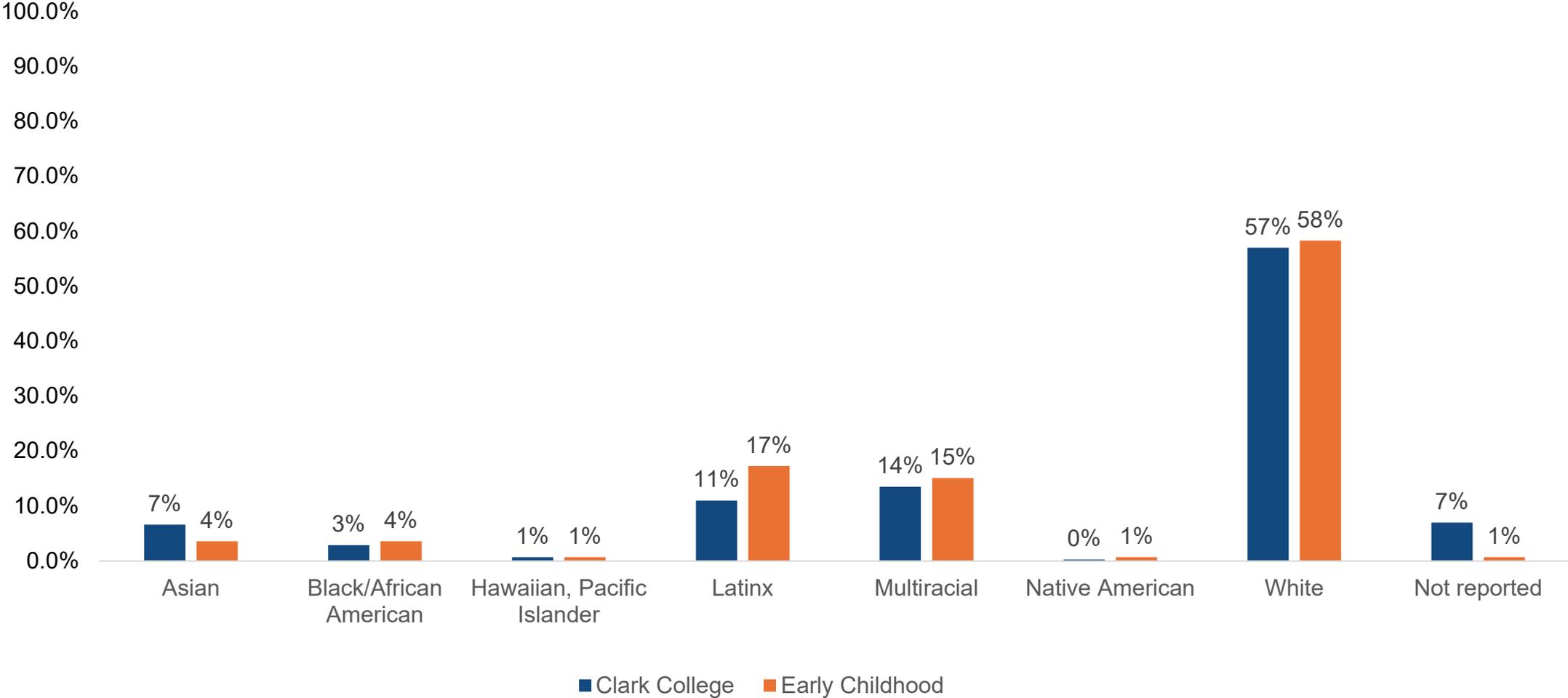

# Office of People and Culture

## Proposed Restructure of the Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion and Human Resources Department:

As part of our commitment to shared governance and our equity-centered strategic plan, Executive Cabinet seeks your input on the potential restructure of the Human Resources and Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion offices. This proposal centers on the creation of an Office of People and Culture as an approach to center collaboration, operational coherence, and a deepen commitment to cultivating an inclusive and engaged college community. Overall, the proposed restructure means that the Human Resources Department and the Office of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion will form one office and operate under the name, "Office of People and Culture." This proposed structural alignment is not merely a response to political shifts, it is a proactive step toward uplifting the mission, vision and values of the college. Your perspective is crucial to this process. Please take a moment to complete this anonymous survey; your feedback will be used to help us make the most informed decision.

## Proposal:

Executive Cabinet is proposing the creation of an Office of People and Culture to transform the way we fulfill our mission. In this proposal, the purpose is to combine the Human Resources Department and the Office of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion into one department (the Office of People and Culture).

## Why is this being proposed?

As we envision the future of Clark College, it is imperative that our organizational structure reflects both our institutional values and our strategic priorities. The proposed integration of the Vice President of Human Resources and Vice President of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion roles represents a bold and likely necessary evolution.

In a rapidly shifting national landscape, we are called to lead with intentionality and foresight. This structural alignment is not merely a response to change; it is a proactive step toward embedding equity throughout our institutional operations. Now is the time to reimagine how we lead, how we serve, and how we sustain our mission. By doing things differently, we position Clark College to thrive - anchored in our values, responsive to our community, and prepared for the future.

## Overview of People and Culture:

Offices of People and Culture can be found at many organizations, inclusive of higher education. Within this structure, there is a more holistic approach to engage and empower people to do and be their best. Services typically focus on hiring, onboarding, the overall employee experience, diversity, equity and inclusion, organizational culture and engagement (Clark College currently refers to this our institutional climate), employee and leadership development, employee and labor relations, compensation and benefits, Title IX response, Bias-based response, cultural celebrations, well-being, and more.

Both areas currently do people work; and it's important to understand this proposal aims to create a deeper sense of community and connection within our college community.

## Goals of the Proposed Restructure:

- **Advance the work** to fulfill our mission and following tenets:
  - Equitable Student Experience
  - Employee Engagement, Empowerment and Excellence
  - Community Partners Engagement

- Institutional Effectiveness and Equity
- **Unified for Impact to:**
  - Expand the way we approach diversity, equity and inclusion across the college community
  - Enhance the employee experience
  - Advance employee growth and development
  - Foster an inclusive and diverse college environment for all to thrive
- **Sustained Community Engagement**
  - Focus on building culture as well as enhancing practices around onboarding, professional development, and leadership growth
  - Deepen community engagement

## Proposed Timeline:

Should this proposal move forward, we will promptly begin the restructure process by November 2025.

## **Process Document for Proposed Restructure**

**July 22, 2025:** Preliminary discussion at the EC retreat to discuss various topics, to include the structure of both ODEI and the structure of Human Resources.

**August 13, 2025:** EC topic discussion: reimagining HR and ODEI - EC discussed various innovative structures to strengthen the HR and the ODEI departments. The next steps include sharing this with them for input and feedback

**August 19, 2025:** EC topic discussion: reimagining HR and ODEI - EC discussed various innovative structures to strengthen the HR and the ODEI departments. EC agreed the next steps include sharing this with them for input and feedback

**August 25, 2025:** VPODEI and VPHR met with Directors of both units (separately) to discuss the proposal to restructure ODEI/HR into one unit.

**August 26, 2025:** ODEI team meeting to discuss proposed structure and collect input/feedback and questions.

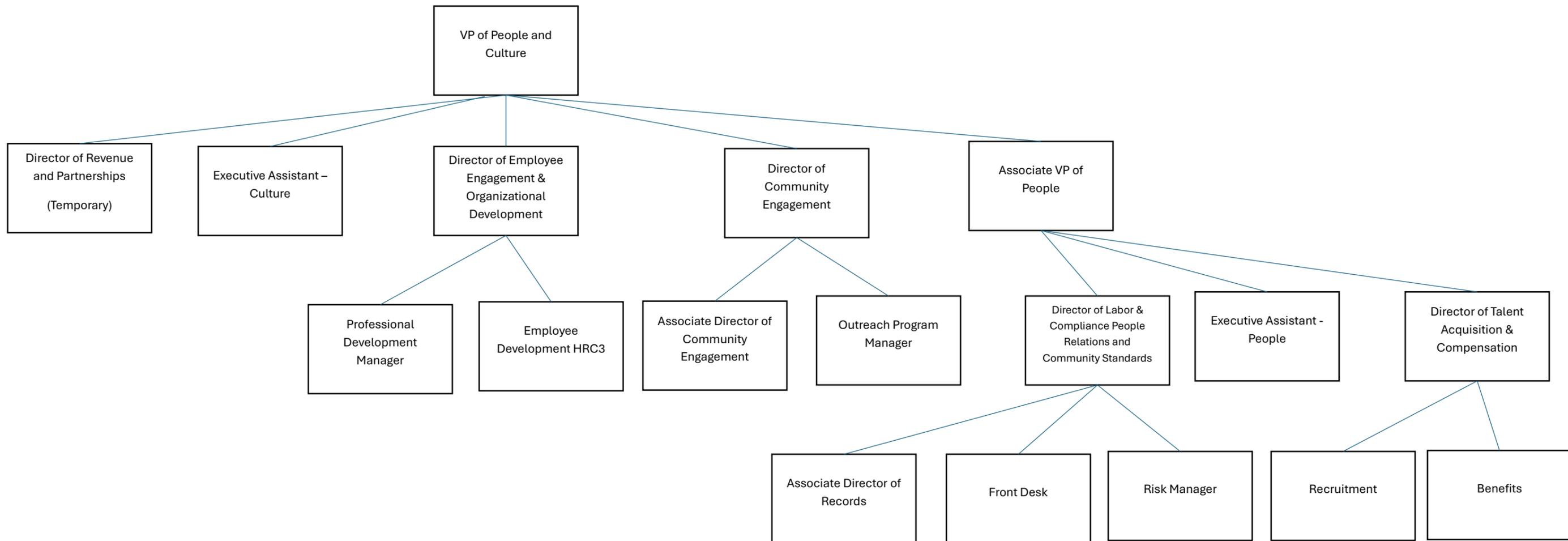

**September 23, 2025:** EC topic discussion: gathering broader input from the college community. Survey will be made available September 29 – October 8. EC will review and discuss data collected.

**9/29/2025 - 10/8/2025:** Collect feedback from the college community.
