

Enrollment Report Fall 2024

- **ALL State FTES:** Fall quarter enrollment is at **4,462** and currently **99%** of our state enrolled and budgeted target. Our fall quarter budgeted enrollment target is **4,493** FTES. *This number is inclusive of the BAS, International FTEs listed below.*
- **BAS:** Fall quarter enrollment is **188** and currently at **121%** of our BAS enrolled and budgeted target. Our fall quarter BAS enrollment target is **155** FTES.
- **International:** Fall quarter enrollment is **56** and currently at **109%** (no change from last report) of our International enrolled and budgeted target. Our fall quarter International enrollment target is **51** FTES.
- **Running Start:** Fall quarter we have **1,695** Running Start students and currently at **101%** of our RS enrolled and budgeted target. Our fall quarter RS enrollment target is **1,676** FTES.


Disability Access Center (DAC)

529 students as the 10th day of the term

- **Common class accommodations for Fall:** extended time on exams, quiet room testing, assistive technology training in screen reader tools, accessible format of textbooks (e-text for audio format, braille, & large print), GLEAN notetaking app for audio recording/transcripts, summary lecture notes from instructor or peer student, flexible deadlines some 48hour extensions, flexible attendance, ASL sign language interpreters, closed captioning of video materials, use of specialized technology in the classroom, recording of lecturers, preferred seating, adjustable chairs or tables, sighted aid assistance for lab class, reader software on tests, and medical alter for seizures. There are additional accommodations, each plan is individualized to the student.
- **Testing Accommodations are still the highest type**, with over 79% of students having at least one type of testing accommodation, such as extended testing time. For in person exams, proctoring is available in our DAC Testing Center.


These 529 students with disabilities are those who have reached out to DAC and are registered for at least one class this Fall. This number includes those who are using class accommodations by 10th day, others who are eligible and will request later in the term, students who have a scheduled Access meeting, and some students who are engaging with us for other out of class supports: Examples: loaning out equipment, priority registration access, physical access support, and check in meetings for disability consultations as relates to programs, classes, or college processes from staff member or peer mentor.





Number of Athletics





Race/Ethnicity of Clark Students, Fall 2024*





Gender of Clark Students, Fall 2024*





Age Group of Clark Students, Fall 2024*





Clark College Student Types, Fall 2024*





Residence of Clark Students, Fall 2024*









First-Time Ever in College, Fall-to-Fall Retention, 2019-2022 Cohorts by Race/Ethnicity





First-Time Ever in College, Fall-to-Fall Retention, 2019-2022 Cohorts by Need-Based Aid Status





First-Time Ever in College, Fall-to-Fall Retention, 2019-2022 Cohorts by Age Group





First-Time Ever in College, 3 Year Completion Rates, 2017-2020 Cohorts by Race/Ethnicity





100.XXX Board Policy Review Calendar

The review process occurs bimonthly over a two-year period from September to July. The schedule is included as Appendix A. This structured approach ensures timely policy updates and ensures the Board maintain policies that align with the institution's current and future needs.

Rationale for the Update:


A Board calendar for reviewing institutional and board policies and procedures is required evidence for NWCCU Standard 2.A.1 (listed below).

The institution demonstrates an effective governance structure, with a board(s) or other governing body(ies) composed predominantly of members with no contractual, employment relationship, or personal financial interest with the institution. Such members shall also possess clearly defined authority, roles, and responsibilities. Institutions that are part of a complex system with multiple boards, a centralized board, or related entities shall have, with respect to such boards, written and clearly defined contractual authority, roles, and responsibilities for all entities. In addition, authority and responsibility between the system and the institution is clearly delineated in a written contract, described on its website and in its public documents, and provides the NWCCU accredited institution with sufficient autonomy to fulfill its mission.



Proposed policy submitted to EC representative for sponsorship


Proposed policy submitted to APPC by EC representative

Proposed policy forwarded to EC for Final approval, returned to initiator, or denied.

If **approved by EC**, the Vice President of Operations will update the Administrative Policies and Procedures Manual and communicate all changes to the college community.

If **returned**, the proposed revision or creation of a policy or procedure may be returned to the originator and sponsoring EC member for additional consideration.

If **denied**, all forms will be returned to originator and EC member with the reason for not adopting the requested revision or creation.



Upcoming Policy Process Changes

200.001 Administrative Policies and Procedures –Approved by APPC 3/14/2024

- Each policy is assigned an EC Sponsor
 - Policy sponsor in conjunction with EC develops a review schedule
 - The College's policies and procedures must be reviewed at least once every five years, unless a more frequent review of a specific policy is required by law.
 - Policy review will also include review of associated procedures
