Lisa Conklin-Bishop, Director/Music Director

It is a truly amazing experience being part of the long line of "Fantasticks" productions since its Off-Broadway run in beginning in 1960. The 17,162 performances makes it the longest running Off-Broadway musical of all time! and is a staple for regional, community, college, and high-school productions since its premiere. While it is humbling to be a part of a long line of productions it is even more awe-inspiring to have the privilege to work with singers, actors, choreographers and crew whose contributions preserve the American art form of the musical. These students, alumni, and community members coming from classes and full-time jobs to volunteer their passion and devotion to such a production is a constant reminder of why we do this—live theater is important, and I would argue, vital to our identity as a culture.
