Licensure Requirements

In order to obtain the Washington State Certification for Emergency Medical Technician, students must:

- > Be at least 18 years of age, and attest to when they graduated from high school or obtained a GED.
- ➤ Have successfully completed the EMT course.
- > Students who have completed EMT 103 and passed with a "C" grade (75%) or higher are qualified to take the National Registry Exam for EMT. (National Registry certification alone does not qualify a student to work in the State of Washington, though it does qualify them to work in Oregon.)
- For Washington certification, students must work for or be affiliated with an agency (paid or volunteer) within 12 months of course completion date. For more information, please visit www.NREMT.org and www.doh.wa.gov.
