To be eligible for selection into the Pharmacy Techn program, the following items must be completed: Complete the Clark College Application for Admission.

Complete this Pharmacy Technician program application. Read and initial each item on page 2., ensuring to complete the high school attestation questions. Your application affords you two selection attempts.

Pay the non-refundable \$50 program application fee. Your application is complete when the fee is paid, and this date is the 'application received' date. This date may be considered in the selection process. (Fees are subject to change.)

Submit official college transcripts if you have transfer credits you wish to apply to the program. Transfer credit and course equivalencies will be determined by Clark College.

The following courses or placement levels are required prior to program entry:

MATH: Completion of MATH 92, BUS 102, PTCS 110, MA 103 or equivalent with a "C" (2.0) grade or higher, or eligibility for MATH 96. (*Must by 7-years current upon program entry*)

WRITING: Completion of ENGL 90 or equivalent with a "C" (2.0) grade or higher, or eligibility for ENGL& 101.

Obtain a minimum Clark College applicable GPA of 2.5 or higher. Applicable GPA courses are: AH 100, 104, 110, 111, BUS 149, CMST& 210 or 230, ENGL 90 and MATH 92.

Pharmacy Technician Standard Technical Requirements

- _Physical and mental/emotional requirements: ability to work in a fast-paced environment, often on your feet for 4-8 hours continuously, as well as bending, reaching and pushing carts with equipment for extended periods of time; Pharmacy Technicians are typically required to carry and lift up to 30 lbs.; use of hands for fine, repetitive manipulation of small objects; ability to utilize various Pharmacy equipment and have basic computer proficiency; keyboarding at 35 words-per-minute with 5 or fewer errors on a 5-minute timed test; must possess excellent customer service and communication skills; the ability to work with diverse patient populations; ability to maintain professional composure around patients that are sick and/or terminally ill.
- Working conditions: positions in pharmacy and/or clinical settings may require working flexible schedules, including nights, weekends and holidays; potential exposure to chemical hazards; ability to wear gloves and other personal protective equipment (mask, coat, etc.) for extended periods of time. It is strongly recommended that all applicants closely observe the activities of those practicing in the profession to understand the technical requirements of the program more fully.
- To participate in this program, students must be able to perform standard technical requirements as described above. Admission to the program may be contingent upon the applicant verifying his or her ability to perform the established technical standards of the program with or without reasonable accommodation (Please reference the disability statement in the online PharmacyTechnician handbook for additional information).
- The program requires a 30 to 40 hours-per-week commitment from students for classes and clinical rotations (not including outside study time or travel time to the clinical site). Reliable transportation is an important consideration as clinical facilities may require driving significant distances (up to approximately 50 miles distance from Clark). Clinical assignments may be offered at times other than traditional clinical hours, such as evenings (other than Monday-Friday, 5:00am-7:00pm) and/or weekends.
- To participate in the clinical externship, clinical sites may require proof of current immunizations. Students should considerstarting the Hepatitis B series and titer as soon as possible as this can take approximately seven months to complete. Please see the program web site for details on immunizations and medical clearance requirements.
- Students enrolled in clinical courses are required to complete a comprehensive Criminal Background Check (as required by the clinical sites). Students should be aware that the clinical site may deny the student access and the student may not be able to complete their healthcare program based on the results of a background check.
- Students may be required to complete a drug screen before beginning their clinical experience at the request of the clinical site. Drug screening costs are the responsibility of the student (approximately \$37). If the clinical site finds the student's drug screen to be unsatisfactory, the student may be dismissed from the program (see substance abuse policy).
 - Health Insurance: proof of health insurance may be required by the clinical site. Keep in mind that you are responsible for your own health and testing requirements should an accident or injury occur. Clinical sites are not responsible for any injury that occurs during externship.
- Washington State Law [WAC 246-901-030(2)] requires that students have completed one of the following to be eligible for selection into the Pharmacy Technician program: high school graduation, GED completion, or higher U.S. degree conferment.
