Career Services

- Organizes career assessment workshops and provides resources for exploring careers and researching potential employers to help students make informed career choices.
- Hosts workshops focused on student success and career readiness to enhance students' career-related skills and knowledge.
- Collaborates with faculty to coordinate opportunities, deliver presentations, and ensure students receive comprehensive support tailored to their career development needs.
- Facilitates connections between students and local employers, industry professionals, and community organizations to provide practical experience and build professional networks.

Career Connected Learning Initiative

The goal of the college-wide career connected learning initiative is to infuse career connected learning into the classroom through curriculum development, pedagogical practices, and intentional relationship between courses and workplace environments. This is primarily achieved through close collaboration with faculty and instructional areas.

- Manages the Career Hub to house career-connected learning and curriculum development tools and resources.
- Serves as a content expert in career-connected curriculum development, integrating industry insights, labor market needs, and workforce trends into academic programs and coursework, while working alongside faculty and other content experts to align education with real-world opportunities.
- Collaborates with campus stakeholders to ensure that communication and knowledge of career connected learning is highlighted internally and externally.
- Collaborates with the Teaching and Learning Center to offer training and professional development to faculty related to embedding career connected learning into courses and students' career pathways.
- Partners with Career Services and other staff to develop relationships and identify opportunities with local employers, industry professionals, and community organizations to facilitate internship opportunities, mentorship programs, and other experiential learning experiences.

- Develops scalable models for experiential learning that can be implemented across departments and programs to enhance student career readiness.
