Dear Clark College Student,

We would like to invite you to apply for the Constance Baker Motley Scholarship. This fund demonstrates Clark College's serious commitment to create a multicultural environment. The Constance Baker Motley Scholarship will be awarded from the fund in the name of Federal Judge Constance Baker Motley, who as a young lawyer represented Martin Luther King Jr. and played a pivotal role in the nation's civil rights struggle.

Scholarship awards will vary in size and will not exceed the cost of twelve credits at Clark College. Awards may be used in either spring or summer quarter.

To be considered for the Constance Baker Motley Scholarship, an applicant must be:

- Currently enrolled at Clark College for at least six credits per term
- A student of color:

Asian: A person with origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or Indian Subcontinent.

African American/Black: A person with origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa

<u>Native American/American Indian/Alaskan Native:</u> A student of indigenous background with origins in any of the original peoples of the Americas, who identifies through documented tribal affiliation or community recognition.

Pacific Islander: A person with origins in any of the original peoples the Pacific Islands.

<u>Latino:</u> A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, South American or other Spanish culture or origin regardless of race

To receive an application packet for the scholarships, please come to the Diversity Center located in Gaiser Hall Room 214 or on the Scholarship wall in Gaiser Hall on the Clark College Main Campus. The Office of Diversity and Equity is available to help you if you need assistance in completing the application.

The application must be turned in to the Diversity Center located in Gaiser Hall, Room 214 by March 3, 2017 by 12:00 p.m.

A fund to assist students of color in financing their education at Clark College has established in honor of Judge Constance Baker Motley, the first Black woman ever appointed to the federal judiciary.

Prior to her appointment in 1966 by President Lyndon B. Johnson, Motley worked as primary trial attorney for the NAACP Legal Defense Fund. She argued 10 key civil rights cases before the U.S. Supreme Court, winning nine, and participated in all major school desegregation cases, representing King and others.
