<u>Course Description</u>: Explore acrylics with a focus on color, composition and pattern. Demonstrations will show color mixing, shading and texture. Work on projects of your choice or suggested demo projects. Mondays, 1:00 - 4:00; 1/8-3/4, 7 sessions, No class 1/15 and 2/19.

Learning Outcomes: As a result of taking this course, students will:

- Learn how the Principles and Elements of Design can enhance their current work
- Understand the history of abstract art and how it has evolved
- Apply subtractive strategies in order to pull the essence from photos and/or still life arrangements in order to create an abstract painting
- Discover how to do "process painting" one layer at a time

Course Schedule:

Week 1: January 8 Introduction to class format and materials. We may start out with some loosening up activities in a "get to know you" atmosphere. Simple figures will be the focus in this colorful exercise.

Jan 15 NO CLASS (Martine Luther King Jr Day)

Week 2: January 22 Shapes. Students will use a variety of shapes, provided by the instructor, to create an interesting abstract.

- Week 3: January 29 This lesson is called ABC's/123's and will result in an abstracted image using only numbers and letters.
- Week 4: February 5 Special lesson on florals "The Three Geraniums". Students will take a complicated image and learn how to choose an appropriate color palette and create quick sketches that capture the essence of the image.

Week 5: February 12 Bring in a photo or image of your choice to abstract.

February 19 NO CLASS (Presidents' Day)

Week 6: February 26 Let's keep going with the abstraction!

Week 7: March 4 LAST CLASS Final abstraction and time for completion of all projects.
