Camera Basics for Beginners

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Course Description:

Take your digital Camera off AUTOMATIC and learn how to use MANUAL modes for best creative control and results, i.e., learn F/Stops, Shutter Speeds, Depth-of-Field, ISO, etc., PLUS Basic Photography tips, Rules of Composition, Lens selection, Pre-Visualization and more so you can consistently create more compelling photos. In this hands-on class you'll learn through exercises, assignments, and photo critiques. For Beginners; not a Photoshop class. Bring camera and owner's manual, 3-ring binder, pen or pencil and Tripod if available.

Learning Outcomes:

Outcome #1: Through hands-on activities you will learn how and when to select and use different camera settings and functions to attain the desired visual outcome.

Outcome #2: You will learn through example and demonstration the basic principles of photography, composition, as well as the art of meaningful seeing.

Outcome #3: By the end of the term, you will be more proficient using your camera, understanding how to compose photographs so you can create more compelling pictures while having fun learning camera basics and principles of photography.
