### Crochet Granny Squares Syllabus

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#### **Course Description:**

This course is intended to teach students who know basic crochet stitches how to make a variety of granny squares, beginning with very simple granny squares and proceeding on to more complex designs.

Students should know basic crochet stitches as follows: Slip Stitch, Chain, Single Crochet, Double Crochet, Triple Crochet

#### **Learning Outcomes:**

Students completing the course will be able to:

- Read and follow simple crocheted patterns, written and graphic
- Crochet a granny square
- Make a puff stitch and a cluster stitch
- Weave in yarn ends
- Sew granny squares together
- Crochet granny squares together

Supplies:

Yarn of any weight and any color. A variety of colors is encouraged but not required. ("Bumpy" yarn is not recommended)

- Crochet hook in the size recommended for the yarn
- Darning Needle
- Scissors
- Plastic grocery bag or other holder for yarn being worked
  - Printout of patterns in the attached document

## **Course Schedule**

### **Week 1: Basic Granny Squares**

Crochet basics review: Slip Knot, Slip Stitch, Chain, Single crochet, Half Double Crochet, Double Crochet, Triple Crochet

Make a “Magic Loop”

Make a ch4 loop

1. Basic Granny Square
2. Empty Granny Square
3. Sunburst
4. Rustic Granny Square if time allows

### **Week 2 – Lacy Granny Squares**

1. Victorian Lattice Square
2. Butterfly Garden

### **Week 3 – Flower Granny Squares**

1. Purple Rose
2. Button Daisy Flower
3. Apricot Rose
4. Potty Little Pansy (If time allows)

### **Week 4 – Complex Granny Squares**

1. Felicitas
2. Abigail
3. Hera Afghan Square (if time allows)
