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Course Description:

- Allons, continuez! Start back up with the elegant French language where you left off
 with French I. This course covers chapters 4 through 8 in "French Fundamentals" by Julie
 Higgins. Each chapter has the same format for building skills on pronunciation,
 vocabulary, phrases, grammar, verb conjugation, dialogues, translations and
 conversation and writing exercises. Instructor has over 30 years experience teaching
 French at Clark. Purchase textbook at Clark College bookstore prior to first class.
- Some background of French is required for this class, or the completion of French I.

Learning Outcomes: As a result of taking this course, students will:

- Learn past and future tenses
- Memorize dialogues that correspond to each lesson
- Recognize and demonstrate a French accent and pronunciation
- Incorporate a variety of simple points of grammar in conversation and writing
- Learn words and phrases that pertain to money matters, playing sports and musical instruments, the workplace, household chores and yard work

 Translations, 6.8: Conversation: Cities, states, countries, motion verbs, passé composé, 6.9: Writing: Travel, motion verbs, passé composé.

 Chapter 7: 7.1: Pronunciation: The letter b, 7.2 Vocabulary: Professions, workplace terms, 7.3: Phrases: The workplace, 7.4 Grammar: Future tense, il est and c'est, professions.

 Chapter 7: 7.5 Verbs: Voir, devoir, vouloir, pouvoir, 7.6 Dialogues: Quel profession? 7.7 Translations, 7.8 Conversation: Professions and future tense.

Week 7:

 Chapter 8: 8.1: Pronunciation: Th, t, s, 8.2 Vocabulary: Household items, chores, gardening, 8.3: Phrases: Chores, 8.4: Grammar: Direct object pronouns.

Week 8:

Chapter 8: 8.5: Verbs: Dire, lire, écrire, 8.6: Dialogues: Au jardin, 8.7:
 Translations, 8.8: Conversation: Household chores and yard work, 8.9: Writing: Yard work, direct object pronouns.
