Course Description:

Experience the joys of watercolor in a positive atmosphere with the support and encouragement of fellow artists. Explore and work on your own projects, brush up on watercolor basics, and/or learn some new and interesting techniques to add to your painting repertoire. Learning Outcomes: As a result of taking this course, students will:

- Enjoy studio space with other artists as they work independently on their own projects
- Be inspired by the discussions and weekly critiques by fellow artists
- Be given the opportunity to experiment with some new techniques as well as reviewing and refreshing the students' knowledge of familiar techniques.

Course Schedule:

Week 1: Jan 7 – Snowy landscape

Artists review techniques needed to paint snow and create a snowy landscape

Week 2: Jan 14 – Creating Greens

How to create beautiful greens without using green paint

Week 3: Jan 21 - It's Pouring

Review pouring techniques and using masking fluid to create painting

Week 4: Jan 28 – Follow-up with Poured Paintings

• Artists have time to complete the previous week's project

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Week 5: Feb 4 – In a Fog

Using techniques to create foggy paintings

Week 6: Feb 11 – Be my Valentine

Using a technique with tape to create a Valentine's Day card

Week 7: Feb 18 – Tissue Paper Paintings

Artists will paint tissue paper and attach it to paper for a landscape painting

Week 8: Feb 25 – B.Y.O.P.

Artists bring in an old paper that they feel needs improvement to be reworked

Week 9: Nov. 26 – Artists' Choice

 Open day for catching up on projects, individual instructions, or suggestions for a project
