Course Description

Have you ever wanted to dive deeper into art history and actually use that knowledge to expand your own artistic expression? In this part history, part studio class, students will learn about specific eras of art history, including notable artists, artistic techniques, and the connection the art had on society while applying that information to create several original works of art. The chosen medium (drawing, watercolor, acrylic, etc.) will be up to each students' preference.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of this course, students will:

Outcome #1:

- Artistic Exploration- Students will become more familiar with the state of “play” in the artistic process. Through experimentation, students will gain a willingness to try new techniques and become more comfortable with making mistakes and messes.

Outcome #2:

- Technique- Students will learn how to use techniques to create both desired and surprising results. Students will be able to apply multiple techniques to achieve complex textures.

Outcome #3:

- Creativity and Imagination- Students will learn to build and strengthen their creative vision. Students will use the basic knowledge of techniques and artistic vocabulary in order to make thoughtful and intentional decisions.

Week 5: Abstract and Abstract Expressionism

- Discuss notable artists, artwork, and social influences. Class Discussion.

Week 6: Application of Abstract and Abstract Expressionism

- Apply what we learned and discussed in the previous week to either a copy of an old master's work or your own, original piece.

Week 7: Modern Art

- Discuss notable artists, artwork, and social influences. Class Discussion.

Week 8: Application of Modern Art

- Apply what we learned and discussed in the previous week to either a copy of an old master's work or your own, original piece.
