## Course Description

Let's paint some skies! Have you ever wondered how to capture certain clouds or types of weather with watercolor? Maybe you're not satisfied with how your skies turn out? In this two-day workshop, we will discuss color, brushes, technique, and anything else that is required for painting successful skies. We will go through as many types as we can to equip you with the skills you need for eye-catching skies!

- Students will learn and apply techniques regarding brushes, paint, and observation to create a variety of realistic and/or artistic skies

## Course Schedule

- Week 1 – Discuss and practice techniques for overcast skies, clear skies, cumulus clouds, and stormy skies.
- Week 2- Discuss and practice techniques for sunsets, night skies, and any requested sky types.

---

## Materials

- All supplies are recommendations. It's ok if sizes, colors, or anything else is a little different. Just remember you get what you pay for.
- Watercolor Paint Set - 12 or more colors (Recommended brands include: M. Graham, Reeves, Windsor and Newton, and Daniel Smith) Tubes or cakes are fine; I prefer tubes.

- Recommended Colors- Paynes Grey, Titanium White, Burnt Sienna, Crimson Red, Brilliant Red, Ultramarine Blue, Cerulean Blue, Yellow Ochre, and brighter yellow
  - Brushes- Flat Brushes and Round Brushes in large, medium, and small sizes, Rigger Brush, and a medium sized Fan Brush
  - Palette- with lid and large mixing well in the middle. Bigger the better.
  - Watercolor Paper-140 cold or hot press, various sizes depending on preference. 9x12, 11x14
  - #2 Pencil
  - Masking Tape
  - Eraser (Regular and Kneaded)
  - Sketchbooks or Drawing Pads (at least 8.5"x11") (Recommended)
  - Photo References- (Recommended)
