

Example Course Equivalencies for Running Start

HS Graduation Requirement	Running Start Course
English	Any ENGL course 100 level or higher or WR course 100 or higher or Communications course 100 level or higher
U.S. History (1.0 credit required for HS graduation)	Any HIST course 100 level or higher focusing on U.S. History
Civics (.5 credit required for HS graduation)	Any HIST or POLS course 100 level or higher that instructs students in the state mandated: (a) Federal, state, tribal, and local government organization and procedures; (b) Rights and responsibilities of citizens addressed in the Washington state and United States Constitutions; (c) Current issues addressed at each level of government; (d) Electoral issues, including elections, ballot measures, initiatives, and referenda; (e) The study and completion of the civics component of the federally administered naturalization test required of persons seeking to become naturalized United States citizens; and (f) The importance in a free society of living the basic values and character traits
Contemporary World Problems (.5 required for HS graduation)	Any 100 level course or higher in the following: Contemporary world history, geography, and problems. Courses in economics, sociology, civics, political science, international relations, or related courses with emphasis on contemporary problems.
WA State History (.5 credit required for HS graduation)	Any 100 level course or higher focusing on Washington State or Pacific Northwest History and/or Government.
Social Studies Elective	Any 100 level or higher course that is focused on "social science". Courses could be in Psychology, Sociology, Anthropology, Humanities, Political Science or other "social sci"
Math (general), Quantitative Math or science (senior year)	Math--Any 100 level or higher math higher than what was completed at HS or in your career pathway Quantitative Sr Year course-- Any math higher than what was completed at HS or that is in your pathway, chemistry, or physics

CTE/Occupational Electives	Any 100 level or higher Criminal Justice, Business, Economics, Accounting, Computer Science, Prof/Tech, Human Services, Medical or other career-related areas.
Health (.5 credit required for HS graduation)	Any 100 level or higher health or personal wellness course
PE	Any 100 level or higher PE, personal wellness, dance class or physical fitness class
Fine Art	Any 100 level or higher music, drama, art, or dance
Science (w/lab)	Any 100 level or higher Astronomy, Chemistry, Biology, Oceanography, Geology, Physics, or other science course

Reminder: 1 College Credit = .2 High School Credit
 ie: 5 credit College Course = 1.0 High School Credits
