

How to Find an Internship

Opportunities are out there – learn how to prepare for and find your ideal internship! Having a clear plan and strategy for your internship search will increase the success of your efforts and help to minimize stress. There are a variety of ways to finding an internship. Visualize what you would like to do after you're done with school. Ask yourself these questions:

- What experience and skills do I need to improve or develop, in order to apply for the jobs I want?
- Do I know what type of company I would like to work for?
- Where would I like to get my foot in the door to expand my network for future career options?

Always keep in mind your overall career and life goals; this will help to guide your plan. The internship search process can be viewed in five simple steps:

- When you choose an internship related to who you are, you are more likely to find your work personally meaningful, and will likely be more successful in what you do.
- ☐ Identify and understand your strengths, abilities, experience, interests and personality traits.

DEFINE YOUR STRATEGY – formulate a plan and determine your career goals

- ☐ Identify employers of interest and potential contacts; what is related to your program of study

 - Conduct research on LinkedIn.com; follow Clark College and connect with Alumni
- ☐ Establish a plan of action and identify resources (e.g. Penguin Jobs, www.indeed.com)

- ☐ Upload resume to Penguin Jobs to be viewed by employers
- ☐ Begin preparing responses to possible interview questions
- ☐ Conduct an <u>Informational Interview</u> to research careers and companies
- ☐ Attend a Student Success Workshop on Interview Skills, Resume Building, or Networking

TAKE ACTION – implement your plan and execute strategies

- Tailor your resume and "elevator pitch" for specific opportunities and contacts
- ☐ Refine interview responses for specific companies and position description
- ☐ Attend Career Fairs and networking events
- ☐ Track your progress and contacts with a job search log

INTERVIEW EFFECTIVELY- communicate and emphasize your values to maximize your opportunities

- ☐ Complete a practice interview with Career Services Employment Supports.
- ☐ Print and prepare ideas for Co-op Internship Training Agreement
 - Identify ideas for learning objectives related to your program of study
- Refine interview responses and prepare questions to ask at the end of interview
- ☐ Follow-up with appropriate thank-you letters immediately following interviews (e.g. card, email)
