

# Clark College Foundation Scholarships



## How Scholarships are Funded

Scholarships are funded by individuals, organizations, businesses, and clubs. Donors have a variety of interests and those are often reflected in the criteria set for the scholarships. This funding should not be viewed as “free money,” but rather as an investment by someone in the community.

## Who Should Apply

Generally speaking, students who have at least 2.5 cumulative grade point averages are eligible to apply for academic transfer and career and technical scholarships. While some scholarships require higher GPAs, 2.5 is the minimum requirement.

The majority of scholarships are offered to full-time students. However, there are scholarships available to those taking less than 12 credits per term. Students should check specific applications for minimum requirements before applying. Students must apply for scholarship consideration each year.

Students in the Running Start program are not eligible for foundation scholarships until after graduation from high school.

## How to Apply

Clark College Scholarship Applications are available online at [clark.edu/scholarships](http://clark.edu/scholarships). Review the application instructions and eligibility statement to be sure that you qualify. Follow the instructions given for each scholarship application and be sure to submit complete applications before the deadline.

## Where and When to Apply

Applications are typically available online by the end of January at [clark.edu/scholarships](http://clark.edu/scholarships). Instructions will indicate whether to submit materials online or to the Financial Aid Office. A scholarship process also opens in September for winter and spring awards each year.

## Types of Scholarships Available

### Academic Transfer Scholarships

Academic transfer scholarships are offered on the basis of academic accomplishments and transfer programs. Some scholarships may require students to demonstrate financial need. To qualify for an academic transfer scholarship, a student must have at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average, unless otherwise noted by the specific scholarship, and must meet the specific criteria of the individual scholarship. Use the Clark College Scholarship Application to apply for these awards.

### Career and Technical Scholarships

Career and Technical scholarships are awards offered on the basis of academic accomplishment, aptitude, and commitment. Some scholarships may require students to demonstrate financial need. To qualify for a technical scholarship, a student must have at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average unless otherwise noted by the specific scholarship, and must meet the specific criteria of the individual scholarship. Use the Clark College Scholarship Application to apply for these awards.

### Department Scholarships

Department scholarships are available to encourage excellence and talent through a number of opportunities. Generally, these scholarships are awarded to students who demonstrate potential and commitment to the particular program or the arts. Athletic scholarships are based on both academic and athletic participation. Selections are made by departments through separate selection processes.

### Transfer Scholarships

Transfer scholarships are awarded to academic transfer students completing their two-year degrees at Clark who plan to attend four-year institutions the fall following graduation from Clark. To qualify for transfer scholarships, students must have a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average, unless otherwise specified, have an associate degree by the end of the academic year in which application is made, and meet specific criteria identified for transfer scholarships. Use the Clark College Transfer Scholarship application forms to apply for these scholarships.

# Clark College Foundation Scholarships Available

To apply for the scholarships listed below, submit a Clark College Scholarship application online. Unless otherwise noted, the scholarships are available for a variety of majors. Some are specifically for career and technical students, and some are for academic transfer students. Applicants must be recent or graduating high school seniors or continuing college students planning to attend Clark College. A 2.5 minimum cumulative GPA is required to apply for the scholarships below.
