 - ✓ Must pass a criminal background check (conducted by Clark College)
- ✓ Mentors are required to attend a **one week** training provided by International Programs <u>and</u> the **two day** Orientation for new international students (make-up trainings are not available).

- International Peer Mentor Training (June 17 and September 12-16)
- International Student Orientation (September 7-8, December 2017 & March 2017)
- Attend quarterly area excursions (ie: Multnomah Falls, Portland Saturday Market, OMSI)
- Attend all scheduled Peer Mentor meetings (dates & times are to be determined)
- Facilitate one Conversation Café quarterly in the Office of International Programs.
- Initiate and maintain contact with your group throughout the quarter (at least 3 times per quarter)
- Invite your partners to join you in campus and community activities throughout the quarter
- Maintain contact with the International Programs Office throughout the quarter and respond to monthly update request
- Complete a monthly time log to document time spent volunteering
