



Immigration Overview: Working On Campus

1. I am a new F-1 student. Can I work on campus?

International Programs recommends you wait one term and first earn a successful GPA (grade point average) of 2.0 or higher.

2. Am I able to obtain a “work-study” job on campus?

No. “Work-study” jobs are federal financial aid for U.S. citizens and permanent residents only.

3. What kind of on-campus job can I do as an international student?

You are able to apply for jobs categorized as an “institutional hire.” Examples of these jobs include working at the child care center or in an office.

4. Am I able to work on campus full time?

When classes are in session, you may not work more than 17 hours per week. During breaks, you may work more hours, as approved by your supervisor.

5. How can I get more information?
