

# Clark College's VP of Instruction recommended for presidency

Rassoul Dastmozd, who has served as Clark College's Vice President of Instruction since 2006, has been recommended for the presidency of Saint Paul College in Minnesota. The announcement was made Mon., April 11, by Minnesota State Colleges and Universities Chancellor James McCormick.

The Saint Paul College Board of Trustees is expected to act on the recommendation at its April 20 meeting. Dastmozd will succeed Donovan Schwichtenberg, who is retiring. In his announcement, McCormick called Dastmozd "a proven leader who has demonstrated a commitment to the vision, goals and values of Saint Paul College." He said Dastmozd is passionate about providing high-quality programs and experiences for students.

The Minnesota State Colleges and Universities system comprises 32 state universities and community and technical colleges serving the higher education

needs of Minnesota. The system serves about 277,000 students per year in credit-based courses and an additional 157,000 students in non-credit courses.

Dastmozd will continue to serve at Clark College through the end of this academic year. The college will continue to communicate with the college community as they begin the search process for a new Vice President of Instruction.
