

Clark women roll to big win over Grays Harbor

The Clark College women's basketball team used balanced scoring and solid defense to beat Grays Harbor 55-36 in an NWAACC game Wednesday at Clark.

Chelsea Dyson led the Penguins with 12 points and eight rebounds, while Fort Vancouver graduate Elizabeth Girtle hit on three of four 3-point attempts for 11 points.

"Liz hit those shots when they needed to happen," Clark coach Nancy Boone said. "I sent her in the game and told her 'Shoot the ball, girl.' And she went in and buried them."

Renee Tzeo added 10 points and Chawncy McClenan had nine points for Clark, which faces Highline at home on Saturday.

Boone said of the Highline contest. "There's a logjam for second and third. We beat them at their place, and I'm sure they'd love to get a split. We'll need to play a better game on Saturday."

At Clark College men 84, Grays Harbor 72 — Stephon Hopkins was 12 of 13 from the free throw line and scored a game-high 22 points for the Penguins.

Clark was 24 of 26 from the line as a team, and made 27 of 56 shots from the field. Derek Thurston and Travis Garrison each added 10 points, and Kevin Nagunst had a game-high 10 rebounds with eight points.
