

Clark College faculty speaker series begins March 5

□ Professor will discuss experiences while in the Republic of Hungary

An English professor's experience during a Fulbright teaching exchange in the Republic of Hungary will launch the new Clark College faculty speaker series on Wednesday, March 5.

Joe Pitkin, of Vancouver, will discuss his experience in Hungary and share the process by which faculty members can become part of the Fulbright teaching exchange. Following the presentation, Pitkin will participate in a question-and-answer session.

Pitkin joined the English department at Clark College

in 2000. After earning degrees from Utah State University and New Mexico State University, he is now completing a degree in environmental science from Washington State University-Vancouver. In addition to his work as a teacher, he is also a poet, novelist and member of the rock band The Gravitropes.

The free public event will

The faculty speaker series will continue on Friday, April 25, at noon, when biology professor and ecologist Kathleen Perillo will share information about her sabbatical journey through Switzerland, France and Mexico.
