## Students honored at Clark reception

Students in the Running Start program will earn associates degrees from Clark College in ceremonies set for June and August. The 86 students will receive their high school diplomas at the same time.

The program allows high school students to earn college credit at Clark College while simultaneously completing requirements for high school diplomas. Of the 86 graduates, two earned perfect 4.0 grade averages who were Russell Miller from La Center and Sara Ross from Prairie High School. In addition, more than half earned cumulative grade point averages above 3.4.

The Running Start students were honored at a May 27 reception on the Vancouver campus.

The Running Start program got its start at Clark College in 1992. The number of graduates this year is a record for the school.
