Reed hopes to rekindle civic engagement by college students just returned from spring break. It wasn't too hard one year ago,

Now, Reed has unveiled a campaign that asks students, "What is one more thing I can do to make a difference in my community?

impact and encourage those around you," Reed said in a written statement.
