CRT

Critical Thinking

The process of analyzing information emphasizing logic, reason, and reflection and interpreting creative works.

Students will be able to:

- CRT**¹ Analyze information from multiple perspectives.
- CRT**² Assess the validity of claims and arguments.
- CRT**³ Formulate well-reasoned arguments supported by evidence.
- CRT**⁴ Apply creative thinking skills to generate new ideas, solve problems and express themselves.

PSL

Problem-Solving

The process of identifying, analyzing, and addressing problems.

Students will be able to:

- PSL**¹ Accurately define a problem.
- PSL**² Analyze problems from multiple perspectives.
- PSL**³ Select the most appropriate solution based on established criteria and desired outcomes.

COM

Communication

The process of effectively exchanging information, ideas, facts, and perspectives in a variety of contexts, situations, and/or mediums.

Students will be able to:

Equity & Inclusion

The process of ensuring equitable opportunities for everyone and promoting the engagement of all individuals.

- EQI**³ Explain how their own biases influence interactions and decision-making.

Information Literacy

The process of ethically obtaining, evaluating, using, and creating information.

Students will be able to:

- INL**² Determine if information, in any form, is credible and appropriate for their needs.
- INL**³ Use and create information while respecting intellectual rights and privacy and reflecting on information privilege.
